

ith just two more home games after today I thought I would look back over the season on how things have worked out and just jot down a few thoughts about the place.

The first thing I would have to say is a massive congratulations to all the guys behind the scenes that make the Seasiders' world go round on match days.

Having stepped back from front line duty after 'cough' years I speak with some authority when I say congratulations to these guys. Chris Daynes probably spends the vast majority of his waking hours in the week (7 days) thinking about everything, from laundry, cleaning, planning permission, building stuff, pitch, junior pitches. I'm sure if I asked, he could quickly add another 50 jobs that need doing now! He runs a team of volunteers who cover the multitude of jobs as they arise. Simply put, without a Chris, there would be no club and without the volunteers helping him, there would be no club.

We are not unique, every club has its volunteers to a greater or lesser degree people do what they can do, sometimes more than they should do, and we should appreciate every single second they spend at the club, trying to make it a better place to visit week on week, month on month and season on season.

The place has been transformed in the past six years from a park pitch with a fence around it to a football stadium that matches any around for atmosphere, the pitch improves every year. This season we've lost just three home games to a frozen (twice) and waterlogged (once) pitch. Six years ago, we would have lost at least double that amount. The main stand is about to have a facelift and three new stands have appeared... we average over 350 spectators every home game and none of it would be possible without our volunteers.

Felixstowe & Walton United moved back into fifth position with a 3-1 win at an inform Basildon United on Tuesday.
Leading from a **Josh Hitter** strike on 36 minutes. Felixstowe should have been

further ahead before the home side took advantage of an error at the back on 74 minutes to equalise. The Seasiders showed great character to bounce back and dominate the remainder of the game and grabbed two goals in the process, Leon Ottley-Gooch heading firmly past the keeper on 81 minutes and Billy Holland nodding into an empty net after Zak Brown had struck the bar with his effort on 86 minutes. Basildon had a couple of chances in the first half from ricochets around the area and Josh Hitter, Noel Aitkens and Ollie Canfer came desperately close to second half goals as the three points were bagged. Canfer was taken to hospital after the match after suffering a nasty gash to his forehead towards the end of the match, he will be doubtful for Saturday's trip to Bury Town and the second part of the Easter blockbuster weekend when Stowmarket visit on Monday.

THE OTHER SIDE STOWNARKET TOWN FC

The club was founded as Stowmarket Association FC in 1883 by a merger of Stowmarket St Peter and Stowmarket Ironworks. Originally playing at the Cricket Meadow, their first match was against Needham Market School. The club were founder members of the Suffolk County Football Association in 1885. By the late 1800s the club had dropped the word "Association" from its name, which had originally been used to distinguish it from the local rugby club.

They joined the newly formed lpswich & District League in 1896, and won the title in its first two seasons and again in 1899-1900. In 1907 they won the Suffolk Junior Cup, beating Westbourne Mills 5-1, and in 1909-10 the club won the league again, with the reserve team winning the second division. They won the title again in 1921-22, before transferring to the Essex & Suffolk Border League in 1925. In 1931 the club won the Suffolk Senior Cup for the first time, beating Sudbury Town 3-1. They won it for a second time in 1933, beating Kirkley 5-2, and again the following season, with a 3-0 win over Bury Town.

At the end of the 1936-37 season the club disbanded due financial difficulties. After World War II local club Stowupland Corinthians began playing at the Cricket Meadows, and joined the Border League in 1946. In the summer of 1947 the club's name was changed to Stowmarket Corinthians, and in August it was changed again to Stowmarket Town. After legal advice, it was changed again to Stowmarket FC.

Under the management of player-coach Jackie Little, The club won the Border League, the League Cup and the Suffolk Senior Cup in 1950-51, beating Sudbury Town 2-0 in front of 10,867 supporters in the final of the latter. The League Cup and the Senior Cup were won again in 1951-52, and at the end of the season



the club joined the Eastern Counties League.

In 1957–58 they won the Senior Cup again, beating Newmarket Town 2–0. They won the trophy for a sixth time in 1961–62, beating Brantham Athletic 2–0. The following year they entered the Suffolk Premier Cup and won it, beating Lowestoft Town 3–0. A seventh success in the Senior Cup was achieved in 1965 with a 4–0 win over Orwell Works, and the Premier Cup was won again in 1977 with a 2–1 win over Sudbury Town after the original two-legged tie had ended level.

In 1983 they were renamed Stowmarket Town, and a year later moved to Greens Meadow. The club won the Premier Cup again in 1986, beating Lowestoft 1-0, and in 1991, when Haverhill Rovers were beaten 3-2 after extra time. At the end of the 2004-05 season the club were relegated for the first time in their history, dropping into Division One, where they have remained since.

After a hiatus of over forty years, the club won the Senior Cup again in 2006-07, beating Grundisburgh 2-1. In 2016-17 season they were Division One champions and were promoted back to the Premier Division. In 2019-20 the club were unbeaten 28 games into the league season, but the league was abandoned due to the coronavirus pandemic.

At the end of the 2020-21 season, which was also curtailed due to the pandemic, they were promoted to the North Division of the Isthmian League.

MANAGERS have this saying which is often spilled during the second half of the season that baffles and amuses us journalists in equal measure.

Some say it more regularly than others, some more genuinely than others, but the fact of the matter is – and whisper it quietly – that we actually don't believe a word they say.

Asked how they assess their team's current form or overall league position, it's quite commonplace to receive a response along the lines of: "I don't look even at the league table until around Easter".

So, I ask myself a) does a manager really not compare his team's fortunes to that of their rivals until three quarters of the season have passed; and, if so, at what point do they finally cast their eye over the standings?

Are we scoring enough goals? Are we conceding too many? Are our rivals outperforming us? One glance at a league table can answer all.

Nine times out of ten, a winning manager will not need to scroll down on their digital subscription to The NLP on a Sunday morning or rush out to the local newsagents, they know themselves whether their team have been good enough to compete in the higher reaches of the division.

One only hopes, however, that Notts County boss Luke Williams is not one of those managers who vow not to regularly check his side's progress.

Losing just two their 41 matches this season, scoring 103 goals along the way, Williams and his Magpies would be celebrating an emotional return to the Football League any other season, but in the most exciting two-horse title race in the National League for years, they

don't even find themselves on top of the pile.

That honour is bestowed on Wrexham, who lead by three points with a game in hand going into the Easter weekend.

Monday's game between the two at the Racecourse Ground promises to be an absolute classic, dare I suggest, the biggest game in Non-League history?

The fact that neither Williams or Parkinson aren't the first managers to be celebrating a promotion or title-winning campaign up and down the country shows just how many top performances we have enjoyed so far this term.

By our reckoning, Worksop Town were the first English champions of 2022-23 after sauntering to the Northern Premier League East division having lost just once all season. They were followed on top of the winners' rostrum by North Ferriby, who continued their rise back to the top tiers by clinching the Northern Counties East Premier division, similarly Macclesfield FC, who made it back-to-back promotions from Step 5 to Step 3 by cruising to the Northern Premier League West title.

And then there's Berkhamsted, who are also celebrating title success after a storming campaign in Southern League Division Once Central.

One thing's for sure, the Easter bunny will be delivering more title success this weekend with the likes of Ebbsfleet United and South Shields among a number of clubs chasing confirmation this Bank Holiday.

One thing's for sure, you can be certain that Fleet boss Dennis Kutrieb and Mariners chief Kevin Phillips will have lived through every permutation and will know exactly what their teams have to do to ensure success.

PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE NORTH ROUND UP

AFC Sudbury played their match at **Maldon** & **Tiptree** on Good Friday, and it was a very good Friday for the Yellows and for striker Nnamdi Nwachuku, who scored a first half hat trick in a three-nil win. Nnamdi took his tally to a rather incredible FORTY SIX for the season, a tally which includes six hat tricks-he's going to need to build an extension just to hold match balls at this rate.

That result saw the Yellows close to within three points of leaders Hashtag United, who had looked a little more vulnerable of late. needing very late goals to defeat Felixstowe and Walton United and Coggeshall Town, and of course losing to Stowmarket Town in between those two. The Tags were on the road to Gorleston, who had been impressive recently, but the visitors went ahead on eight minutes, Matthew Wooldridge breaking the deadlock. Before the half hour mark it was two-nil, Alex Teniola making his side more comfortable - and right before the end of the match they added a third, Jermaine Francis ensuring that his side restore their six point advantage - and there are only three games to go.

Third place **Lowestoft Town** started the day with a five point advantage in the battle for the final home play off spot. They were also on the road, travelling to **Basildon United**, and the Trawler Boys were ahead after only eight minutes, Jake Reed's twenty second of the season. Reed added another ten minutes

later, and then completed his hat trick with only twenty seven minutes on the clock. After the break Ben Allen got one back for the hosts, and then it was all hands on deck as Callum Fitzer reduced the arrears once more. The visitors held out, and their advantage in the battle for that home advantage is now six points.

Stowmarket Town have been hit hard by the manager/performance/goalkeeper of the month awards curse (yes, they won all of them for March), losing both matches since the start of April. Our fourth place side faced the stern test of visiting Heybridge Swifts, who started the day only a point behind in sixth spot and had won their last three- and just how stern a test was demonstrated after only nine minutes, Myles Anderson putting Swifts ahead. On twenty one minutes Matt Price made it two-nil, but soon after the restart Chris Casement got one back. Stow's comeback hit difficulties when Ed Upson saw red soon afterwards, and soon they went down to nine, Jack Ainsley the next to be dismissed. Unsurprisingly they couldn't find an equaliser, and Swifts take their fourth place, Stow down to fifth.

Felixstowe and Walton United had to fight hard to win at Basildon United in midweek, but win they did, and they occupied fifth spot at kick off courtesy of a better goal difference than Heybridge Swifts. The Seasiders travelled for a local derby, **Bury Town** their hosts - the Ram Meadow side also picking up a late midweek win and finally looking as if they'd found their mojo, with only one defeat from their last four bringing to an end a very poor run. The visitors went ahead on twenty five minutes, Zak Brown with the opener, but they were quickly pegged back, Joe White levelling from the spot seven minutes later. Town took the lead with seventeen minutes to go, White once more doing the damage, and made it three when Max Maughn scored with just seven minutes left. United drop to seventh, one point outside of the top five.

Grays Athletic hoped to bridge the gap between themselves and the top five as they travelled to face relegation-threatened Great Wakering Rovers. Athletic had only one win from their previous four, whilst Rovers had looked much improved, losing only one of their last five, but had an eight point gap between themselves and safety. Rovers opened the scoring four minutes before the break, David Knight with the goal, but they were ahead for just those four minutes, Callum Leahy quickly levelling. Right at the end the visitors got a winner, Callum Watts lifting them to sixth place- only goal difference keeping them out of the top five.

We had a mid table battle as **East Thurrock United** played host to **New Salamis**. The Rocks underwent major chance a few weeks ago and had consequently lost their last four – and they were quickly behind once more, Nathan Mandla scoring after just five minutes. Salamis added another fifteen minutes later, Harrison Georgiou with that one, but with seven minutes to go the Rocks made a match of it, Ayo Odukota with the lifeline. They made the most of it, and right at the end Max Fiddes delivered an equaliser.

Coggeshall Town saw their relegation fight boosted with six points this week, as apart from defeating Stowmarket Town they were awarded three points for victory over Great Wakering Rovers in February - a match which was abandoned with seconds remaining after a serious player injury with the Seed Growers ahead. That still left them seven points from safety as we kicked off – and they had a difficult match, **Wroxham** coming to call. It took until thirteen minutes from time for a goal to arrive, and Coggeshall scored it– but in the wrong end, the Yachtsmen taking the lead. The visitors scored one of their own to make it two-nil with three minutes remaining, Ryan Hawkins taking his tally for the season to double figures, and they held on for victory. The Seed Growers are seven points from safety with only three matches remaining.

Witham Town started the weekend with a seven point gap between themselves and the danger zone - and had a massive match, as Tilbury came to call. Victory could - depending on other results - even ensure Town's safety, but with the Dockers having fallen into the automatic relegation positions this week things are even more desperate at Chadfields - and they were given something of a boost when, with the game goalless, Town saw Rhys Madden sent off. They Dockers took advantage, Alex Clark putting them ahead just after the restart, and they held on for three points - but are still six points behind their hosts with three matches to go.

Brentwood Town had the opportunity to condemn visitors Hullbridge Sports to - at best - a relegation play off, and it looked grim for Sports when Solomon Ogunwomoju scored after just three minutes. Sports levelled on eighteen minutes through Martin Tuohy, but within ten minutes were behind again, Matt Cripps restoring home advantage - and it was three-one just before the break, Ross Wall the scorer. Wall added another twelve minutes after the restart to make it four, and got his hat trick with thirteen minutes left- five-one the score.

GUNDI: THE BULGARIAN HERO

t first it seems a simple question. Who is the greatest Bulgarian to have ever played the game? The nation boasts just one Ballon d'Or winner, and that man, Hristo Stoichkov, became a legend both for his country and for Barcelona, one of the giants of the European game. He is rightly regarded as one of the finest footballers of his generation. So why is it that if you ask the question in Bulgaria, you'll likely get a different answer?

Georgi Asparuhov – Gundi – was born in the middle of the Second World War, in Sofia, and spent most of his childhood in the post-war chaos demonstrating his prodigious talent in the city's youth league. As he turned 15 in the late 1950s, he was invited for a trial at city heavyweights Levski Sofia, and duly taken on as a member of their under 16 side. It wasn't long before he made his mark there as well, with his manager Konstantin Georgiev reporting to the first team that 'there is nothing we can do with him' to make him better. 'The boy is a born footballer.'

Gundi didn't stick around in the youth teams for long, and he was in the first team, at just 17, against Botev Plovdiv. Tall and imposing, the Levski coaches thought he was a natural centre back, despite Gundi's belief in his attacking talents. Grateful, however, he lined up at the back, but he couldn't contain his own talents. He quickly became known for both goalscoring and for dribbling out of defence, often embarrassing his opponents. When he was called up for Bulgaria's youth teams, and excelled. In a tournament in Austria, he jinked past two players and scored from almost the



halfway line. Everyone agreed, he was an attacker, and that's where he played from then on.

National Service threatened to stall Gundi's career just as he made his breakthrough, but he was allowed to continue playing for the club nearest to where he was stationed; Botev Plovdiv. In his two seasons, he transformed them from mid-table fodder to genuine title contenders, finishing third and then second. But his heart was in Sofia, and when he was released from the military he went back to Levski. By now he had become an imposing striker. Tall, strong, fast, he was a defence's nightmare. In 1965 Levski won their first title in 12 years, with Gundi scoring 27 in 29. He then went



off with the national team to a difficult World Cup qualifier against Belgium, which Bulgaria were expected to lose. In a performance described as 'divine' he scored twice to send his country to the finals, and would be nominated for the Ballon d'Or, ahead of Franz Beckenbauer and Ferenc Puskas.

With Levski in now European Cup action, it was inevitable that some European giants would come knocking. After three goals against Benfica, the Portuguese champions made an approach, with Eusebio declaring that he craved to play alongside the Bulgarian. Milan were the most persistent though, making repeated offers. Bulgaria, under strict communist control refused to let him leave the country.

The 1966 World Cup was a disappointment for Bulgaria, but Gundi flourished. In a group of death with Brazil, Portugal and Hungary (with Ballon d'Or winner Florian Albert). Gundi scored his side's only goal, but was unable to carry the team himself with so much talent against him. He left disappointed, but with his reputation further enhanced.

Unfortunately, his heroics just made him more of a target in what was an increasingly violent Bulgarian league. Injuries threatened to finish his career early, but it was to end in far more tragic circumstances.

Having been injured once too often, and

unable to play for Levski, Gundi was invited to a celebration by Botev Plovdiv, who still loved him from his two season spell there a decade earlier. He took his international teammate Nikola Kotkov with him for the ride, and picked up a hitchhiker on the road. As he made his way down the Hemus motorway, his Alfa Romeo lost control and smashed into a truck. The car was set alight, and all three men died. Kotkov was 32, Gundi was 28.

In 1999, he was voted (ahead of Stoichkov) as Bulgaria's greatest ever player. He was placed 40th on FIFA's list of the greatest players of the twentieth century. It is impossible to guess how his reputation might have changed had he moved to Western Europe, but one suspects he might be much more readily remembered. For Gundi, though, he achieved his dream. One audacious attempt by Milan to lure him across the Iron Curtain, with the promise of \$500,000, a contract level with the highest paid player in Italy, and most importantly, safe passage out of the Communist bloc, he responded by saying 'there is a country called Bulgaria, and in this country there is a team called Levski. You may not have heard of it, but I was born there and there I shall die.' Tragically, he was right.
