Good afternoon all. Welcome to the AGL Arena for our last scheduled home league fixture of the season, and what a season it has been!

With this being the final league game of the season I thought my Chairman and mate Tony Barnes and I could have a look back at the season, hopefully you will enjoy our thoughts whether you agree with them or not...

Hi mate, thanks for taking the time and joining me on this. At your time of life (soon to reach the big 60) I hope the old grey matter doesn't let you down lol!

TB: Hi mate, a pleasure although as you have suggested I might not remember things quite as clearly as youngsters like yourself but I'll do my best...

HIGHLIGHT OF THE SEASON?

TB: If you are asking for one particular performance, for me it would be the home league fixture against Champions Lowestoft Town. We completely dominated the game and I left knowing we had the ability to win the league and indeed hold our own at level

3 next season. Jack was outstanding in not allowing Lowestoft's main man Jake Reed hardly a kick. Beating local rivals Bury early on was also very enjoyable, not just because of the performance, but just because it was against Bury!

AC: This is between two for me. The home game against Lowestoft when we literally ripped them apart and for 90 mins they didn't have an answer, the most complete performance I have seen from a Felixstowe side for many a year. Although the next performance isn't for the whole game but Leiston in the semi was remarkable. A patched up side, eleven fit seniors, players out of position all over the place yet the sheer grit, determination and togetherness in the second half was incredible. As a member of this club I walked away from that night so immensely proud of us having stuck it to them, so it has to be this game, second half.





HOW THE HELL DID WE GET AWAY WITH THAT MOMENT!

TB: The one game that I left thinking how the hell did we leave with all three points was probably the pre-Christmas derby game at Ipswich Wanderers. It was a game that we should have won comfortably but we simply didn't perform and allowed ourselves to go down to their level, a very scrappy game that often looked as though it was Wanderers who should be higher in the league and us who should be struggling. Henry Barley was introduced on the hour and duly grabbed a later winner – it was defo a case of played shite, but got the three points and get on with next game.

AC: This is a tough call as we have made life so very difficult for ourselves at times particularly in the second half of the season. Recently, Witham and Brentwood at home, with the boy Brown saving the day on both occasions. Those that travelled will remember also recently Enfield away. However for me it has to go to the Premier Cup game early in the season when we played lower level Hadleigh at home. They battered us for most of the game with it looking like Charlie's brother would end up with the bragging rights in the Warren family. However right at the death up stepped Charlie to break Hadleigh's and his brothers heart scoring a wonderful free kick.

GOAL OF THE SEASON?

TB: This is where the old grey matter lets me down, so apologies for all the goals that I've forgotten. In recent times it must be Josh Hitter's wonder hit here against Wanderers to salvage a point, top bins from 25+ yards out, closely followed by Zak's winner at home against Witham.

AC: Sometimes it's not just about the sheer finish, it's the build up, pressure etc. Again Charlies free kick against Hadleigh, Hitters last minute equaliser on the opening day at Maldon along with some wonderful headers during the course from Leon, Bully, Jack etc. Taking everything into account I'm gonna plump for Zak's winner against Witham. To start it's the two subs that have come on (praise to the manager) combining to create and finish (Fordy setting it up), the simplicity of a player getting his head up and picking out a player, Zak actually called for it, then just a simple yet quality finish. A very important three points.



BEST DAY OUT?

AC: Without a shadow of a doubt it has to be our trophy clash away at Billericay. For me it's everything I love about local football. Going to a club higher in the pyramid, a good coach journey (a couple of beers with Mr Isacks),

the people running their club were so warm and welcoming, happy to share ideas and thoughts. Good quality beer plus a decent burger, all this was capped with us scaring the living crap out of them on the pitch. At one point I was serioursly thinking we could go on and win it. However not to be but the after match hospitality was first class with a lovely meal accompanied by a couple of glasses of shiraz.

TB: My best day out is judged by how sore my head is the following morning and our annual pub crawl trip to Bury is always the most enjoyable. Early train, in The Beer House for 12 noon, couple more pubs on way to ground, and a great night out with friends in the evening - this yearmade even better as it was a great game of football too with Henry Barley notching a second half brace to make it 3-3

PLAYER OF THE YEAR?

TB: Very tough call this year, the work rate of Josh Hitter, the quality of Noel Aitkins and





Charlie Warren, the attitude of Stuart Ainsley and Leon Ottley-Gooch the early season form of Sam Ford all deserve a mention, but for all round consistency and reliability I have to go with Jack Ainsley, and I do belive that the title would have been ours had it not been for Jack's injury in the last seconds of the Brentwood game, having seen us gain only five points from last 15 available.

AC: This is generally a pretty tough one but I feel due to our horrendous injury list this term it has been made a little easier as we lost a lot of consistency in the second half of the season. Then saying that they do say form is temporary and class is permanent and I feel this was personified by Ainsley Jnr until his awful injury that ended his season. I can't remember him putting in a less than 7.5/10 performance since his return to the club. I had sincerely hoped that he was going on to play every minute of every game and prior to his achillies injury this looked liked a real possibility. So despite missing the last part of the season Ainsley Jnr is my player of the season, followed by Charlie Warren, Ainsley Snr and Josh Hitter as runners up.

What a horrible game of football that was, and the dog was sick in the car on the way!



BEST FOOTBALL FOOD?

TB: Contrary to popular belief, I dont often sample the burgers or hot dogs, normally just the free hospitality food at half time.

Lowestoft Town take some beating alongside Bury and another Suffolk side, Stowmarket Town. Essex sides are generally pretty poor on the hospitality front compared to all our suffolk friends - a legacy from the fantastic friendly rivalry that we always had in Eastern Counties football.

I did have one particularly nice burger away at Enfield, played at Bishop's Stortford - fully loaded with all the trimmings, delicious!

However having heard so much about the food served at Tilbury (Grays home this season) I finally succumbed and had there classic cheese burger. Noel Aitkens was amongst those yellow carded for the melee that followed and his second followed shortly after for an innocuous tackle. The Seasiders scored what turned out to be the winner on 84 minutes when Sam Ford's smart play from a goal kick allowed him to burst forward and cross for **Zak Brown** to finish sweetly. The drama was not over yet, two minutes from the end an elbow from a visiting forward was missed by the officials but not by Blunkell in goal who had to come off with broken ribs. Attacker Josh Hitter took his place in goal with all substitutions already made and he saw out the 13 added minutes with two good saves to save his team and get the biggest cheer of the day.

THE OTHER SIDE:

NEW SALAMIS FOOTBALL CLUB

New Salamis FC were formed in 1971 by fans of Cypriot club Nea Salamis Famagusta, with the Cypriot based club acting as a parent club to their fans in the UK. Playing in the KOPA, (Cypriot Football League) a British League set-up for Cypriots in London, the club won countless honors and left the league in season 2017/18 as the league's most successful team, winning 12 LeagueTitles.

The club also won a record 7 London County Cups. In the 2015/16 season the club won the FA Sunday Cup, following a 1-1 draw with Barnes at Selhurst Park and winning on penalties. In 2016/17 the club lost to Hardwick Social Club on penalties again following a 1-1 draw, at Brammall Lane.

In 2018/19 we moved into the Herts County Senior League, playing our matches at Enfield Town FC. In our first season we won the prestigious Aubrey Cup Final, and also achieved promotion to the Spartan South Midlands League, after finishing runners up. Season 2019/20 saw us participate in the Spartan South Midlands League Division One at Step 6, our ambition to achieve promotion to Step 5.

In March 2020 when the Covid-19 pandemic hit, we sat top of the league with a certain top four finish. We also were the top scorers in all top 10 Divisions as the season was null and voided. The following season saw the team reach the first round of the FA Cup, in our first season, and when the season was curtailed in November, we had managed to amass enough points to be promoted to



the Premier Division on points per game over two seasons, this season sees a new chapter.

The 2021/22 season was undoubtedly our most successful yet. Playing in the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division, we began the season with the ambition to make it into the top 6. We began with a rocky start, having only secured 4 points in our first 4 games and went crashing out of the FA Cup in our first game. Richard Georgiou, former Salamina player, then took over as manager and transformed the team into a potential title winning side. Bubsy took the team on a 10 game unbeaten run to begin his time at the club, with an emphatic 10-0 win over Oxhey Jets being very memorable. After a disappointing loss to title contenders Risborough Rangers the squad dug deep to keep up the hope of promotion. After many more memorable games, 8-0 vs Holmer Green, 9-0 vs Harefield & 8-1 vs Aylesbury Vale we got ourselves into a position to win the league. In the last game of the season, we went away from home against 2nd place Risborough Rangers with the winner of the game winning the league title as well. In front of a packed crowd, we took control of the game and eventually won 2-0 against a very strong Risborough side. We won the league, finishing on 94 points with 124 goals scored.





Last season was a real test for the club as we were promoted into the Isthmian North Division. This league presented itself as extremely difficult, featuring teams such as Hashtag United, AFC Sudbury and many more great clubs. After a rough pre-season, not winning a single game, we were predicted to finish second from bottom in the league. This gave everyone at the club a determination to prove everyone wrong and be the real underdogs. We began our league campaign with four impressive results, 3 wins and a draw against well-established Isthmian clubs. The team's form then went up and down throughout the season, eventually finishing on 55 points in 38 games. Some memorable games for the club include our 4-3 victory over Felixstowe and our 2-1 win against Lowestoft. Our first season in the league led to an impressive 9th place finish, 10 places higher than we were predicted. The 2023/24 season begins with a new management for the club, with former player Tommy Boxer joining Finlay Johnson as joint managers. Joining them are assistant managers Ricky Brennen and Steve Wolfe. Lys Demetriou, better known as Mr Salamina, remains at the club for his fourth season as Goalkeeper Coach, Kit-Man & Club Secretary, Yianni Porkou also joined the club this season as our super physio from Cyprus.



DON'T WASTE A DAY

'A day without football is a day wasted.' The words of legendary Austrian manager Ernst Happel might seem like hyperbole, even to him, but his approach to the game was a demonstration of his philosophy in action. He was too young to have been coached by Hugo Meisl directly, but the legends of the Austrian Wunderteam and their Danubian Waltz inspired his career. He made his debut for Rapid Vienna four years after he joined the team at just 13, and he went on to win six Austrian league titles, an Austrian Cup, and in 1951 a Zentropa Cup (also known as the Mitropa Cup, a forerunner to the European Cup). He went to the World Cup in 1954 and helped his team to their best ever finish of third. But however successful his playing days, it was as a manager that he would make his impact across the European game. In 1962, he took the vacant job at Ado den Haag.

Happel's first training session, making the players stay out in the rain until they could demonstrate ability at his own level, makes him sound like a hard manager, but he was a product of Vienna's coffee house culture. What had developed as a pastime of the intelligentsia had been adopted by football fans in Austria, where staff and players and fans and journalists would meet and discuss the directions of their teams. In den Haag, he sought ideas from his players and listened when they came to him. It took five years, but Happel was willing to wait for his moment. Eventually, he hauled the perennial relegation strugglers up the table, and into the Dutch



Cup final, where he would meet his legendary counterpart, Rinus Michels.

Ajax, like all Dutch clubs, played a 4-2-4 system. Happel withdrew one of his forwards into midfield. It caught Michels out, and den Haag won the most unlikely of victories. It was the perfect end to Happel's time there, because if he could beat mighty Ajax with such a small team, just imagine what he could achieve with more resources. Feyenoord, Ajax's great rivals, decided not to imagine, and appointed him to find out for sure.

Feyenoord were not in a bad place. They had just won the league, and were heading into Europe. At his first attempt, Happel took his side to the final of the European Cup, where they came up against Jock Stein's Celtic. The Scottish champions also played a 4-2-4, so Happel withdrew his forward once again. Celtic held the Dutch side until extra

time, but couldn't stop the onslaught. Stein would say that Celtic didn't lose to Feyenoord, he lost to Happel.

Happel won the Eredivisie and the Intercontinental Cup over the next few years, before leaving in 1974 and embarking on a peripatetic career across Europe. But his adopted home kept calling to him, and in 1978 he took on the big job, taking previous runners up The Netherlands to the World Cup.

The Dutch job was a tricky one. He took on a side built by his rival Michels, and there were high hopes that they could go one better. But off the field problems drastically undermined their chances. Building up to the competition, armed robbers broke into the home of Johann Cruyff and tied up him and his family. The Dutch legend wriggled free and chased the attackers away, but was too shaken to leave his family for Argentina. The Netherlands went without him, and played some of the most spellbinding football ever seen at the World Cup. But it wasn't enough, and once again they lost the final to the hosts. It's the furthest a manager has ever gone with a nation that's not his own.

Happel went back to trotting around Europe, before a call from Hamburg gave him a second shot at glory. Inspired by Franz Beckenbauer, the German side won the Bundesliga in Happel's first season, and once again went all the way to the European Cupfinal. Against Juventus, he proposed man marking Michel Platini out of the game, but coffee house culture still ruled. The players

told him it was unnecessary, and he listened. They rewarded his trust with his second European Cup. The usually reserved Happel danced along the touchline at the final whistle, a spectacle likened to the Pope in swimwear as it was so strange.

In 1987 he moved back to Austria, to take charge of Swarovski Tirol. The provincial side won the double in 1989, and retained the league title in 1990. In 1992, he was given the national job, trying to see his side into the European Championships. Sadly, he died of lung cancer only a few months later, unable to see out the campaign.

Happel ended his career as the very first manager to win the European Cup with two teams. He was also the first to win four different European league titles. If a day without football is a day wasted, he didn't waste a day in his life.

New Salamis were the hosts for title chasing Lowestoft Town, the Trawler Boys knowing that victory might even secure them the title - but that defeat might see them knocked off the top. There seemed little chance of that defeat after only seven minutes had passed, as by that point an own goal and a goal from Sam Johnson had the visitors two-nil up, and Johnson made sure that any nerves were calmed when Johnson added a third five minutes into the second half. The Salamina got a goal back seven minutes from time, Derek Asamoah with a consolation, but that was that - and the visiting fans began to party, as defeat for Bowers and Pitsea meant that they were champions. Bowers & Pitsea knew that victory over Walthamstow could see them top of the table if Lowestoft Town lost at New Salamisand although that might have looked a rather large 'if' the side from the Len Salmon knew that, if the unlikely happened, they'd need three points to pounce. They went ahead eight minutes before the break, the



goalscoring hero - as usual - Matt Price, and they quickly added a second, Benas Vaivada making it two-nil just five minutes later - but if they thought they could relax, the visitors had other ideas, Tariq Straker pulling a goal back deep in added time at the end of the half. Walthamstow may have had only pride to play for, but they levelled two minutes into the second half, Joinville Renee with the equaliser, and then stunned the home fans by going ahead on sixty four minutes, Bilal Sayoud making it three-two. Two minutes from time Stow added a fourth, Kymani Thomas leaving the home faithful scratching their heads.

Bowers stay second, but their title hopes are over. They are two points ahead of Bury Town and Felixstowe, four ahead of Brentwood Town.

Brentwood Town were two points away from third place Felixstowe and Walton United at kick off and wanted victory to keep themselves in the race for a home play off spot. Visitors Brightlingsea Regent were unlikely to be pushovers, however, with only one defeat in nine, and they went ahead on the quarter hour mark, Charlie Collis with his first goal for the club. The other Collis, Teddy, has been in fine form in front of goal, and the Regent number ten made it two-nil with his ninth in ten matches, twenty one minutes remaining and the Arena silenced- except for the travelling fans. Regent are up to seventh. Before the match the fans of both sides had a drink together.

Bury Town were comfortably qualified for the play offs but had seen their charge up the table slow in recent weeks, drawing three of their last four- but they were firm favourites as second bottom Enfield came to call, the visitors having taken one point from the last thirty available to them. Cemal Ramadan is having a fine season, and he started this match superbly, putting Town ahead on seven minutes and adding another within sixty seconds. It was three-nil on twenty three minutes, Ollie Yun looking to have wrapped up three points, and the same player added the fourth three minutes into the second half. Bury had a fifth just before the hour, Max Maughn making it five-nil, and they weren't yet finished, Ryan Holland getting a sixth two minutes from time. That was that, the hosts up to third - and still with a chance of taking second place.

Heybridge Swifts were at home to Wroxham, but it was the Yachtsmen who quickly took the initiative, Ryan Hawkins putting them ahead after just four minutes. That turned out to be that, and it left Swifts in eighth, Wroxham in twelfth.

Ipswich Wanderers welcomed **Redbridge**, and it looked as if they'd rolled out the welcome mat far too readily in the early stages, the

Motormen going ahead on seven minutes through Louie Johnson and adding a second from the spot just a minute later, Jack Chawner holding his nerve. The Motormen added a third with eleven minutes until half time, Johnson once more, and the number ten confirmed his hat trick with the fourth goal for the visitors just after half time. Just before the hour it was five, Solomon Ogunwomoju continuing the rout, and that's where it ended – the visitors having lost only one of their last eight.

Stowmarket Town, confirmed relegated and without a win all season, got off to a flyer against Basildon United, Kalum Benham scoring in the first minute - but it took the Bees only one more minute to level, Kye Jude quickly equalising; indeed, this match had delivered two goals before many of the others had even kicked off! The match had a third goal on nine minutes, and again it went to the hosts, Stanley Fovargue making it two-one but again the Bees quickly hit back, Ruben Bartlett-Antwi levelling. United then went ahead, Samir Ali making it three-two eight minutes before half time, but Stow quickly levelled through Dylan Kirk to make it three-three at half time. The seventh goal of the afternoon arrived with eleven minutes to go, and it went to the visitors, Clyde Semazzi putting them four-three up - a lead that this time they held.

Witham Town welcomed Grays Athletic, and it looked as if the match would be goalless at the break, only for a home penalty in added time to be converted by Josh Osude. The Town number ten had his twelfth goal in eighteen matches eleven minutes from the end, and that turned out to be that, Town in fourteenth – twelve points ahead of their sixteenth place visitors.
