After that intense period to take the lead, the game settled down without too much excitement at either end, and the boys held on to take all three points.

So here we are, sitting at the top of the league on Boxing Day and facing a Wanderers side that has endured a difficult season so far, sitting at the bottom of the table. However, with this being Boxing Day, a local derby, and with several ex-Felixstowe players in their squad, this is definitely not a fixture we can take for granted.



It was fantastic to see club captain Billy Holland back in the side on Saturday. It feels like an eternity since we last saw him on the pitch. His physicality and leadership will be vital for our promotion push.

On behalf of the players and management, a very Happy Christmas to you all and welcome to today's Boxing Day fixture vs Ipswich Wanderers.

We go into today's game on the back of a crucial three points picked up away at Gorleston which sees us start the festive fixture programme sitting on top of the league. With some way to go, no one is getting carried away with themselves but standing on the touchline hearing our travelling supporters sing 'we are top of the league' made me proud that we have been able to give something back to the fans in return for their unwavering support both home and away.

We were really pleased with our performance across the 90 minutes and whilst we were fully prepared for the difficult pitch conditions and a team that were consistent at home, the boys still needed to execute an approach that showed our style and quality can be adapted for different opposition. We spoke about being clinical in moments and Willie and Charlie (both assisted superbly by Cameron) certainly were that in the second half. I have fond memories of working with all three and was particularly pleased to see Henry making a return to Step 4. We wish them all the very best for the remainder of the season under newly appointed manager Bruvs.

CHRISTMAS time is for giving as they say, well the fixtures computer has certainly served up a festive treat for Non-League fans everywhere this yuletide.

Traditionally, the Boxing Day fixtures are one of the first fans look out for when the schedule is announced – and this year hasn't disappointed with a number of crunch derby clashes taking place up and down the country.

Whatever the level, you just can't beat a derby-day cracker to complete your Christmas, so here are just a few that have caught the eye of our NLP groundhoppers.

The National League always seems to serve up a Boxing Day feast with all the trimmings – and the Aldershot Town v Woking derby is usually at the forefront.

Just 12 miles separate these rival clubs, just across the Surrey/Hampshire border, ensuring there's never any shortage of drama for the big crowds on show.

There's a Tyne-Tees affair when Gateshead and Hartlepool United meet at the International Stadium, while Dagenham v Braintree and Southend United v Ebbsfleet United ensure that Essex and Kent are well represented on the day,

At Step 2, Brackley Town and Learnington looks tasty in National League North, similarly the Derbyshire dual between Buxton and Alfreton Town and an 'Old Farm' East Anglian derby with King's Lynn Town hosting Needham Market.

A big day in the north-east is further demonstrated by Darlington v Scarborough Athletic and Spennymoor Town v South Shields, not to mention Stockton Town v Hebburn Town in the Northern Premier League, Premier Division at Step 3.

The South is equally as intriguing, An all-Hertfordshire clash between Hemel Hempstead Town and St Albans City is a worthy headline act, while Aveley versus Hornchurch and Tonbridge Angels v Maidstone United are big games in Essex and Kent respectively. Chippenham Town v Bath City is often a tasty affair also.

The NPL also serves us up with Matlock Town v llkeston Town and Bamber Bridge v Lancaster City, while at Step 4 there are two more all-north east affairs between Bishop Auckland and Consett and Dunston v Newton Aycliffe.

AFC Rushden & Diamonds v Corby Town is always an eagerly-awaited affair in their respective parts of Northamptonshire, while in an ultra-congested Midlands division, packed with local affairs, unbeaten Quorn and Shepshed Dynamo, separated by just seven miles, battle it out in Leicestershire. All eyes in Manchester will be on Wythenshawe when bitter rivals FC and Town meet at Hollyhedge Park, while Hednesford Town v Stafford Rangers looks a Boxing Day battle of heavyweights to rival Usyk and Fury.

The Southern League Premier Central is always full of crunch local affairs and Boxing Day doesn't disappoint with AFC Telford United and Halesowen Town or Bromsgrove Sporting v Stourbridge arguably the pick.

The Somerset clash between Tiverton Town and Taunton Town always whets the appetite in the west country, while Havant & Waterlooville and Gosport Borough love a battle on the south coast.

And if you're in or around the Beaconsfield area of Buckinghamshire then why not make the trip to Holloways Park where they take on close rivals Flackwell Heath in a lunchtime showdown.

In the Isthmian League, the all-Essex affair between Billericay Town and Canvey Island gets the juices flowing, as does the Sussex derby between Horsham v Bognor Regis Town and the north London clash between Hendon and Potters Bar Town.

Margate versus Ramsgate is undoubtedly the game of the day in Step 4 as the two Kent coast promotion rivals lock horns, while Hartley Wintney v Farnham Town, a local battle of third versus first, is also well worth a visit.

At Step 5 and 6, of course, derbies are a little more commonplace but there are a few, mainly, cross-town affairs that are sure to whet the appetite of the locals.

1874 Northwich v Northwich Victoria ticks all the boxes for a Boxing Day bonanza, as does Newcastle Benfield v Newcastle Bue Star in Ebac Northern League Division One.

And division two produces two more in the form of Chester-le-Street Town versus Chester-le-Street United and Sunderland West End v Sunderland RCA.

The lunchtime affair in the United Counties League Premier North between Newark & Sherwood and Newark Town bares all the hallmarks of a cracker, similarly Northampton ON Chenecks v Northampton Sileby Rangers in Premier South and the Division One fixture between Retford United and Retford.

And, if you're on your holidays on the Isle of Wight and missing your football fix, then how about East Cowes Victoria v Newport (IoW) in the Wessex League.

Wherever you are in the country, you're never far from a crunch local derby to savour. Combining the spirit of Non-League with the spirit of Christmas, it's truly one of the highlights of the football calendar.

But wherever you go and whatever you do, The NLP wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.







IPSWICH WANDERERS CLUB HISTORY

The Club started as an under 14's boys team in 1980. Two yrs later **1980** they entered the lowest division of the Ipswich Sunday League. > Joined the newly formed Eastern Counties Division One 1987 sponsored by Jewsons in 1987 as founder members.

- > Home games were played at our present ground at Humber 1994 Doucy Lane, under the name of Loadwell Ipswich. Jimmy Barker became a very influential chairman and he negotiated a name change to Lancaster Ipswich FC before we eventually became Ipswich Wanderers. Jimmy died in November 1994 and his presence is sadly missed. Thankfully after all his work he saw the floodlights switched on in September 1994 in a match against Ipswich Town.
 - > Great ground improvements were made in the early years under the direction of Development Officer Roger Woshalo and ground Manager Tim Davey.

A losing Suffolk Senior Cup appearance in 1996/97 lead to the following season becoming Champions of Division One, under the Chairmanship of Alan Haste, nine points clear of Maldon Town and losing only three league matches all season. Reaping the rewards of a successful youth policy which saw numerous trophies filling the clubhouse cabinet, a well organised side with a good balance between youth and experience saw us establish ourselves as a Premier Division side for a number of seasons until we suffered relegation on the last day of the 2002/3 season at Wisbech

The following season saw Jason Dozzell join the Club as Manager and after a midtable finish in his first campaign, the -05 second season saw the Club sweep to the 1st Division title and with the assistance of Kevin Cunningham and Glynn Hague, the team finished 7th in the Premier Division in 2005/6, with the League's second best defence with home crowds on average exceeding 100.

> At the end of the 2005/6 Jason Dozzell and Chairman David 2006 Bugg left. Local businessman Ed Nicholls became Chairman and John Clarkson was appointed Manager having arrived with a reputation from the West Country. During the season he guided the club to the final of the Ridgeons League Cup, the 5th round of the FA Vase and a Suffolk Premier Cup Semi Final against Ipswich Town.

> At the end of the campaign John left the Club and with an 2007 exodus of players, the Club appointed ex player Louis Newman 20 to the role, Louis built a young, inexperienced squad and after a poor start to the campaign which included some record defeats, was replaced by another former player Steve Buckle who was brought in to rebuild the squad and hopefully retain the Clubs's premier status. Unfortunately Steve was unable to prevent relegation and the only positive from the season was the Reserves capture of the Chell Trophy defeating Wroxham.

Despite Steve's best efforts over the following few seasons 2011 the Club failed to build a promotion push throughout the and after a poor start to the 2011/12 season, Steve and Assistant Paul Grainger parted company with the Club. New chairman Terry Fenwick appointed Glenn Read and he brought in his own players and former Stowmarket Town boss Steve Jav as his assistant. He quickly revamped the squad and had the Club climbing the table before the end of the season.



> The 2012/3 season saw the Club just fail to clinch promotion to the Premier Division and lose on penalties in the semi final in the First Division Cup. The season did finish on a high as the Club clinched its first ever Suffolk Senior Cup trophy defeating local rivals Whitton United in the final. It was a remarkable victory coming from a goal down in normal time and then from 3-0 down in the penalty shoot out.

2013/14 saw promotion achieved with two long unbeaten runs. 2013 ensuring a return to the Premier Division, we also lost a tight Senior Cup final against Whitton United and set a new club -14 record with a 12-1 win over Downham Town.

The 2014/15 was mixed as we adapted to Premier Division 2014 and finished 9th and enjoyed a good run in the FA Vase but off field the club lost one of its driving forces Roger Wosahlo -15 mid-season.

> In 2015-16 we defeated Canvey Island in the FA Cup and enjoy 2015 our best ever FA Vase run but with a heavy fixture backlog, relegation fears were only ended just before the season end. Glenn stepped down at the end of the season and for 2016-17 the Club appointed Shane Wardley as Player/Manager.


Shane's first season saw us almost emulate our highest ever 2017 position, however, after a poor start to the 2017-18 season Shane resigned and following a disastrous spell under Mark -18 Benterman, club legend Mark Goldfinch took over the side ably assisted by James Buckle and Daniel Thrower, Unfortunately, relegation could not be avoided and in 2018-19 we consolidated and lost in the Senior Cup Semi Final to Cornard.

> In 2019-20 with Stephen Boyle taking over as Chairman, we 2019 rebuilt and after a sticky spell in October we were closing in on the promotion pack and reached a Semi Final of the Suffolk -20 Senior Cup before the season came to an abrupt end. With further additions on field and some good improvements off field under Stephen's leadership, we then looked to gain the vital promotion required for us to take the next steps forward with a good squad. The start to the next season was positive and a second Senior Cup trophy was clinched in the delayed final with a single strike from Connor Field clinching the trophy.

After a couple of Covid-19 disrupted and curtailed seasons, for the 2021/22 season Wanderers went into action in the Thurlow Nunn First Division South. With what became a tight run affair and particular rivalry with Buckhurst Hill also aiming for the title, it went almost to the wire, Wanderers finally having the upper hand, and lifting the trophy with a goal 10 seconds from time in the final home game. With the final of the Suffolk Senior Cup to follow, we finished the season with 26 straight wins, and a well deserved double of league and cup was won!

> The following season started with four cup fixtures in the opening 7 games, and a haul of just 3 points from the first 5 league games meant Wanderers were already playing catch up -21 when our league campaign really got going. A run of 6 wins in an 8 game unbeaten run helped to move us up the table before another rare defeat. More wins followed until in January, we visited top of the table Thetford, which ended in a 1-2 defeat. After this, Wanderers embarked on another 17-game winning run to the end of the season, including coming from behind to avenge the result against Thetford, going above them and ultimately become Thurlow Nunn Premier winners - back to back champions - and into Step 4 football for the first time in the club's history.

> The 2023/24 season, the first for the club in the Isthmian League North came with added pressure - both on and off the pitch. A poor start to the season on the pitch brought a change -24 in September, with the departure of Mark Goldfinch & James Buckle. Glen Driver came in as manager, with the task of keeping the club clear of relegation. Off the pitch was a mammoth job with a huge amount of work needed to pass the ground grading requirements to stay at this level. The inspection in April brought a great deal of relief, and along with the efforts of Glen and his team on the pitch, meant the aims for the season were achieved. Now to move forwards into 2024/25 and properly compete...

LONG JOHN

Giorgio Chinaglia was born into the postear defeatism of an occupied Italy, and raised in the care of his grandparents until, aged just eight years old, he set off across Europe alone to join his parents in Wales. A child of exceptional talent, and exceptional arrogance, his career struggled to take off in England as he rejected Cardiff City and struggled with discipline at Swansea Town. Then he got a letter from the Italian government, calling him up to national service, and his career turned around.

His time in the army was spent in a special footballers battalion, meaning his only duties were to train every day, and to get a special pass when the club he joined - Massese - had a match. By his own admission, without that letter, he probably would have spent his life getting drunk in Wales. Not that it all went swimmingly for him, at the start.

Having played abroad, he was banned from joining a Serie A club for three years. Massese were in the third tier, as were his second club, Internapoli. He was seen as a very British player, big and physical, but technically lacking. It was in his two seasons at Internapoli that he earned the nickname Long John, after John Charles, and also a reputation as a busy forward with a good strike rate. When his three-year exile was up, he got his wish to play in the top flight. Along with Darlington-born Joseph Wilson, he was signed by Lazio.

His first seasons in the capital were a struggle. Chinaglia managed 21 goals across his first two campaigns, and Lazio were relegated, before he found his form in Serie B and fired them back to the top table. But the Lazio dressing room was split, although it was claimed that it was on



personality rather than politics. It didn't stop Chinaglia showing his support for the heirs to Mussolini's fascists. Such was the dislike in the squad that the factions changed separately, and all bought guns. According to goalkeeper Felice Pulci, the cabin whenever they flew was like an armoury.

On their return to Serie A, the rivalry seemed to inspire them. They missed out on the Scudetto by two points. The only place Chinaglia was more popular than on the Curva Nord was in Rome's bustling nightclubs. He enjoyed time away from football so much, he even released a single.

The following season saw Chinaglia called up to the national side to play at Wembley, where he set up the winner for Fabio Capello. That same season, after scoring the winner against Roma, he celebrated in front of their supporters. He received so many death threats, he started carrying his magnum everywhere, not just to training. But he revelled in the intensity, and in the return fixture, he did the same again, just to rub it in. He scored the winner in the final game of the season, as Lazio secured the title.

24 goals in just 30 games ensured he was called up to the World Cup squad in 1974, but his



temperament got in the way. He was substituted in the first game against Haiti, and made it clear to staff that he would play the full game or no game at all. They obliged, and refused to play him for the next game, which flared his temper even more. He ended up storming out of the squad, as Italy failed to deliver an expected World Cup.

Lazio's fortunes also faltered, finishing fourth in 1975 and fighting relegation in 1976. Chinaglia had run out of road in Italy, and when his American wife moved home to the States, he followed. Landing in New York, he marched into the offices of the Cosmos and declared that they would sign him, or he would start his own team and play for them. The Cosmos signed him.

Anyone who thought playing alongside such luminaries as Pele and Franz Beckenbauer hadn't been paying attention. In his own mind, he was the star. He reportedly made Pele cry at one point, after forcefully making that point. But Cosmos fans loved him as Lazio fans had, and he repaid their idolisation with 231 goals in 234 appearances. They won the championship four times with him at the head of their attack, before he eventually retired.

Chinaglia tried his hand at management, but his personality was not well suited to that field. But at Lazio, he is a legend. In the famous Ristorante di Sabatino there is a picture of Saint Padre Pio, who claimed to have physically fought Satan and his demons. And just above him is a picture of a man, arms outstretched, in the blue of Lazio. Not that he was ever a saint.

Onto Saturday now, and leaders Bury Town were back at their own Ram Meadow to face ninth place Brightlingsea Regent. The Blues started the day two points clear at the top, and searching for a seventh successive victory, and they had a fabulous start, Cemal Ramadan always reliable in front of goal-putting them ahead on six minutes with his seventeenth goal of the season. Regent levelled midway through the first half, Teddy Collis with his eighth goal in fourteen matches, and on sixty four minutes the visitors silenced the home crowd once more. lake Clowsley giving them the lead. Despite the best efforts of their hosts, Regent would not be moved - and climb to eighth with three points, whilst Bury slip to second.

Felixstowe were on the road to a different seaside, Great Yarmouth, where they took on **Gorleston**. The Seasiders had last lost a league match on October 12th, so were looking to take their unbeaten run up to thirteen matches, but they fell behind on eleven minutes, Christy Finch taking his tally for the season to eighth. The visitors drew level in the early stages of the second half, Willie Clemons with the equaliser - his third goal in four matches - and just after the hour Charlie Warren did what he does best, taking his tally to twenty four for the season and putting the Seasiders two-one up. They held onto their lead, and now we shall have to see if they can hold onto the summit, as they climbed above Bury Town by one point, albeit having played one game more.

Witham Town were also on the road, our third place side making what looked like a tricky trip to face seventh place Waltham Abbey. It looked even more tricky when Lewwis Spence put the Abbotts ahead on twelve minutes, and trickier still when Aaron Eyoma made it two on the half hour. Immediately after the start of the second half the visitors got a goal back, Andrew Sesay scoring it, but the Abbotts soon reestablished their two goal lead, Nathan Koranteng making it three-one just after the hour, and right at the end they added a fourth, Eyoma sealing a fine victory. The Abbotts climbed to sixth, Town remain third.

Brentwood Town kicked off our Pitching In Isthmian North weekend against Maldon and Tiptree on Friday evening, and the Blues main man, Daniel Ogunleye, put them ahead on twelve minutes- his twenty second goal of the season. Brentwood had won five in a row and hoped to make it six, but the Jammers were also in good form, six unbeaten, and earned a point when Josh Lee levelled five minutes after the break. Brentwood are fourth, the Jammers thirteenth. Heybridge Swifts were at home, worst luck. Our fifth place side have been magnificent on the road, and indeed only they and league leaders Dover Athletic were still unbeaten away from home as we kicked off - but at Scralev Road had a record which matched that of second bottom Newmarket Town, only two wins from ten. It looked like the visit of **Basildon United** might provide more of the same when Reon Smith-Kouassi put the Bees ahead after just seven minutes, but two minutes before half time Mark Chidi put Swifts ahead and in added time just three minutes later they got a penalty, Andrew Fennell converting. What they had, they held - a rare home victory clinched, and perhaps that might end their home hoodoo! Swifts remain fifth, two points above Waltham Abbey having played an extra match. The Bees haven't defeated Swifts in eight attempts.

Wroxham welcomed **Tilbury** to the Norfolk Broads. The Yachtsmen started the day in nineteenth, four points from safety, and lost narrowly in Brightlingsea last time out, but were three unbeaten prior to that and had looked much improved of late- and they looked likely to continue that improvement when Josh Harvey put them ahead eleven minutes before half time. The second half saw no further goals- although it did have a Dockers penalty which hit the post- a result which takes Wroxham to within a point of safety and sees the Dockers slip to seventh.

Grays Athletic saw **Walthamstow** arrive at Chadfields - and they probably wish that the East Londoners had stayed away. Athletic had slipped to eighth after losing their previous two matches, whilst Stow had only one defeat from seven and three wins from four- so perhaps it was no surprise when Bilal Sayoud Tayo Oyebola put the visitors ahead midway through the first half. Tayo Oyebola almost immediately added a second, and twenty minutes from time it was three-nil, Jordan Peart with that one. Callum Ibe made it four-nil two minutes from time, and finally the Athletic agony stopped, their visitors now only one point and one place behind them.

Redbridge welcomed **Cambridge City** to East London. The Motormen started the day in tenth,

only four points away from the top five, and took an early lead in this one as they looked to climb closer to a play off place, Oscar Shelvey-Negus the scorer on fourteen minutes. City delivered an equaliser just after the hour, Samrai Gebrai the scorer, and right at the end the visitors grabbed a winer, George Smith making it two wins from two and lifting his side to fourteenth.

Bottom side **Ipswich Wanderers** found themselves eight points from safety at kick off against **Concord Rangers**, and, although they had been showing improvement, had not been able to pick up many points - indeed, their previous nine matches had brought only one. After a goalless first half it looked as if we were going to have a goalless second half, too, but there was another hammer blow for the hosts thirteen minutes from time, Thomas Stagg putting the Beachboys ahead. They tried for an equaliser, but a minute from time Stagg struck again, Rangers climbing to twelfth, the gap between Wanderers and safety now up to nine.

Mile End found **Sporting Bengal United**, in eighteenth, facing the side who were above them only on goal difference, **Mildenhall Town**. United had picked up one point from their previous five matches, Hall were looking to avoid a third consecutive defeat, and they traded early goals, Ben Nolan putting the visitors ahead on fourteen minutes only for Joe Gregory to immediately equalise. The scoring, as it turned out, stopped there.

Haringey Borough welcomed the side one place and one point behind them in the bottom four, Newmarket Town. Borough went ahead on twelve minutes, Bobson Bawling the scorer, and in the early stages of the second half added a second through Derek Asamoah, but the nerves will have set in amongst the home faithful when Ryan Cole got a goal back with twenty two minutes left, such has been their inability to protect a lead this season. On this occasion, however, the Coles Park faithful were allowed to celebrate, as the lead was maintained- Borough now two points from safety.
