league with the Suffolk Premier Cup Final to occupy us on Wednesday night followed by 4,5 or 6 of the biggest matches in the club's history.



Interview with CAMERON FORDE-BROWN

Today, we're joined by one of the brightest talents in the midfield, Cameron Forde-Brown, let's get to know him a little better...

Tell us about the football team where you started your career and how that journey has led you to your current position at King's Lynn FC.

I started my career early at grassroots and signed for Southend United u10s where I played up until the age of my first year pro at 19. The club were going through a tough financial time which was well broadcasted and led me to spend a brief spell at Millwall u21s which again furthered my development being surrounded by internationals and players who are championship level.

I then decided that 21s was no longer what I needed and wanted to kick start my career as a pro in first team football where I joined Kings Lynn Town with a plan to break into the first team, which quickly happened.

How did the opportunity to play for Felixstowe & Walton United FC come about?

I actually was injured this pre-season and only featured for the first two games at Lynn and off the back of a season where I didn't play as much I wanted to, so I said to myself that this season I need to go and make a name for myself regardless of the level in senior football. The gaffer told me that Felixstowe had been interested in me from the summer heading into this season off the back of Boards watching me in a Suffolk Cup game against Ipswich Town. I was on loan briefly at the time with Ipswich Wanderers before getting recalled after





eight games last season. My immediate reaction after speaking to AC on the phone was one of positivity as the clubs philosophy totally suited my play style and both Felixstowe and I could see me fitting in straight away... which has seemed to work a treat over the course of this season.

You've been recalled to your parent club Kings Lynn FC twice during the season. How was that experience for you and how did it feel missing matches for Felixstowe in the mean time?

To be honest it was a nice moment to see that my performances were being noticed and warranted two recalls. In the seven games that I did feature for Lynn between the two spells the gaffer and I were pleased with my progress and the level seems comfortable to me now. However there was also a part of me that didn't want to go from playing week in week out to featuring off the bench. It's funny because they say to never fall in love with a loan player but roles were reversed as even if I was miles away playing up north for Lynn I'd always be checking the Felixstowe scores hoping the boys were collecting more and more cherries! Playing games and being available for every game this season bar one or two for Felixstowe has made me into such a better player/ character and has given me a robustness and boosted my development at such a faster rate then if I was just occasionally playing here or there or playing u21 football.







Which team do you support and who is your football idol?

Arsenal and I don't have a football idol never have done never will. I try to pick apart players at the top levels game in my position and add them into my game to become the best version of myself.

Have you always played the CM role?

I actually started off as a striker coming through at Southend and it was only until the last three games before our scholarship decisions that a manager thought to play me as a number 8/10 and ever since then I've played there.

Who do you feel you have formed a good connection with on the pitch this season?

In some dressing rooms you get clicks or groups that tend to hang around each other which then transfers onto the pitch but this Felixstowe group has a special bond where I get along with everyone on and off the pitch. If I have to say a name I'd probably say Charlie Warren as we talk alot on matchdays and within the game in terms of movement and where he and I want to be receiving the ball to create chances.

Your spectacular goal against Sporting Bengal on Saturday definitely caught the eye. What went through your mind at the time and have you ever attempted a Paulo Di Canio-style kick like that before?

To be totally honest there just little things I used to mess about with in the garden or over the park as a kid. That's the first time in my career to date where I've tried that in a match. Nothing really went through my mind to be honest the ball just sat up nicely in the air and my instinct took over.

Can you talk us through one of your most memorable moments this season?

There's been so many moments this season which I'll remember throughout the remainder of my career.. and we as a team are not done just yet creating them but I'd probably say the Bishops Stortford game in the Cup. The night before the game I was bed bound with illness and barely got any sleep, so to open up the scoring and then smash six past them as underdogs was a nice moment.

With the Cup Final coming up next week, how are you preparing for such a big game? What are your thoughts on our chances?

I like to treat every game the same both mentally and physically in terms of preparation, whether it's playing bottom of the league or a Cup Final like next Wednesday. So to be honest nothing will change for me at all and I won't view the game any different to if it was a league game on Saturday.

Looking ahead, we are still in the hunt for promotion. How confident are you in the team's chances of achieving that goal? What do you think will be the key factors in securing promotion?

Togetherness and selflessness for sure will see us through. From the moment I walked in the door quality and scoring goals has never been an issue. We are the best team in the league, and I'm not God to behold the future but it's got that feeling that it's a promotion type of season. What will be will be!

With the news that Boards and AC will be departing at the end of the season, has it had any impact on the mentality of the players? How has the team reacted to the announcement, and does it affect your focus going into the final stretch of the season?

The news broke at the time where I was recalled by Lynn so I wasn't actually present for any announcements just ended up seeing it publically. But for sure us as players especially the ones who have played under them for a prolonged period will want to leave Boards and AC with something to show for all the hardwork they've put in whilst being in charge at Felixstowe.

Finally, what are your aspirations for the rest of your career?

To win a EFL play-off final as captain and to play in the Champions League.

But Non-League football, where the game is at its purest, still proudly holds its traditional values and there's one day a year in particular where that humility comes to the fore; April Fool's Day.

Fueled largely these days by their social media presence, football clubs simply can't resist playing a light-hearted seasonal prank on their supporter base and, let's face it, it gets us every time!

Take Ebbsfleet United's Liam Daish being pictured holding aloft a Usain Bolt shirt with his 100m record 9.58 emblazed on the back after the club announced they had clinched the signing of the Jamaican sprinter.

Or, how about when the United Counties League announced they were to trial VAR – a reveal so convincing that it even fooled some FA chiefs into questioning the move around the boardroom table.

This week, of course, the tricksters were out in force again – and your Non-League clubs didn't disappoint.

Many pranks involved aspects of stadia with Tiverton Town revealing their intention to paint their pitch in the club's yellow and black colours in a spirited attempt to rally the team for the final stretch of the season.

Farnborough FC announced that their pitch was to double up as a heliport, as an extension of Farnborough Airport, while neighbours Aldershot Town revealed, Del Boy style, that they had discovered a natural spring at their EBB Stadium and would be offering Aldershot Natural Spring Water in the near future. Water cheek!

Crowborough Athletic went a step further by announcing plans to move into a 'world-class'

all-seater stadium dubbed "Wembley of the Weald", while Radstock Town also unveiled plans to build a brand-new stadium on the site of an old Co-Op supermarket.

Bishops Cleeve unveiled a new slick oil colour shirt (which actually looked quite nice) in conjunction with a sponsorship deal with petrochemical giants INEOS, while Welsh club Colwyn Bay announced that, as from next season, the club will be known as the Turtles rather than the Seagulls, as part of our new partnership with The Blue Turtle Group, with the team running out to the song 'Turtle Power'.

So, once again for April Fool's Day, our Non-League clubs have done us proud while reminding us that amidst all our airs and graces as football fans, there is always room for a lighter side.

PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE NORTH ROUND UP

Brentwood score six, Felixstowe eight, Regent four, Bury three, and we've wins for Gorleston, Redbridge, Grays, Newmarket and Wroxham on a day packed with drama!

Leaders Brentwood Town held onto their three point advantage despite defeat last weekend, because none of their closest challengers could win either. The Blues were back on their own patch, Mildenhall Town the visitors, and went ahead after only nine minutes, Daniel Ogunleye from the spot- and four minutes later it was two-nil, Ade Cole doubling their advantage. Hall hit back four minutes later, Jordon Nicholson halving the arrears, but the next goal, just before the hour, went to the hosts-lesse Olukolu making it three-one. Ogunleye made it four-one with twenty four minutes left, and on sixty eight minutes claimed the match ball, making it five-one. Still they weren't finished, Benas Vaivada making it six-one, but finally the punishment ended there for the visitors. The Blues remain three points clear.

Felixstowe and Walton United hadn't been at their best of late, taking five points from the previous fifteen available, and the Seasiders needed to rediscover their mojo as they travelled to take on a rather desperate **Sporting Bengal United**. The East Londoners were eight points



from safety and in danger of their Isthmian stay becoming a rather brief affair, without a win in thirteen matches- and their desperation grew after only two minutes as Toby Stevenson put the Seasiders ahead. Fifteen minutes later Thomas Warren made it two, and the same player made it three five minutes before half time. A minute into the second half the other Warren, Charlie, made it four, and on the hour Sam Ford added a fifth. The Seasiders didn't rest, and six minutes later had a sixth goal, Callum Harrison with it. It was seven-nil nineteen minutes from time, Cameron Forde-Brown with that one, and still the goals didn't stop, Thomas Warren completing his hat trick with the eighth with twelve minutes to go. Finally, a little mercy was shown, the Seasiders stopping at eight- and staying second, three points behind the leaders. Sporting are now eleven points from safety with five matches remaining. Bury Town had taken five points from the previous fifteen available to them, and welcomed a **Walthamstow** side who had very much lost their way during the same period, taking just two points from eighteen. All the pressure was on the hosts, and they fell behind after only three minutes, Louie Johnson putting the East Londoners ahead- but they hit back in double-quick fashion, levelling on ten minutes courtesy of Cemal Ramadan and going ahead only a minute later, Luke Brown with that one. Ramadan made it three-one six minutes into the second half, his twenty sixth goal of the season, and that was where the scoring ended. Bury remain third, three points away from the summit.

Fourth place Waltham Abbey saw a twelve match unbeaten run come to an end last weekend. but with only six points between themselves and the leaders certainly shouldn't be discounted from the title race. The Abbotts played host to a Maldon and Tiptree side who had only one defeat from six and who deservedly defeated the leaders last time out- and the match waited fifty five minutes for a goal. When it arrived it went to the hosts, Lewwis Spence the scorer, but the lammers struck back on ten minutes later. Kai Brown levelling the scores. The Abbotts went down to ten men eleven minutes from time, Hassan Nalbant dismissed, and quickly the visitors took advantage, Kien Connolly putting them ahead. The ten men hit back, Prince Domafriyie making it two-two, but nobody could find a winner. The Abbotts slip to fifth-but have an eight point cushion over the chasing pack in the battle for a play off place.

Fifth place **Brightlingsea Regent** had opened up a six point gap between themselves and the chasing pack in the fight for a play off place - and indeed were only seven points behind the leaders as we kicked off. Regent were very much the form team amongst the title contenders, losing two of their last ten and winning seven of them, and they hoped to at least maintain that six point advantage as they travelled to **Heybridge Swifts**. The visitors have seen forward Louie

Kudiabor turn down a number of approached of late, and he proved his worth once more, scoring his seventeenth of the season to give his side the lead eight minutes before half time, and he got his eighteenth in added time to give his side a two-nil lead at the break. Just after the hour Michael Okafor made it three, and Kudiabor claimed the match ball five minutes later making it four-nil

Swifts got a goal back three minutes from time, Charlie Stimson scoring it, but it didn't stop Regent climbing to fourth-still seven points behind the leaders but nine clear of sixth place.

Sixth place **Tilbury** couldn't really have had a tougher challenge as they travelled to ninth place **Gorleston**. Thirteen points away from a play off place, it looked to be too late for the Greens to get involved in our end of season party, but they were FIFTEEN matches unbeaten so posed a rather difficult test for the Dockers, who, six points away from fifth place, very much needed a win. We waited until four minutes from time to get a goal, and when it came it went to the hosts, Joe Jefford scoring it- and in added time Ryan Curtis made it two-nil, securing three points. Gorleston climb to eighth, and are twelve points away from the top five. Tilbury now have eight points to make up and five matches in which to do it.

Borough had gone five matches without a win and, despite drawing their last three, very much needed to start picking up three points rather than one. They went ahead on fifteen minutes, Scott Mitchell the scorer, and looked as if they'd take three vital points- only for Alfie Mason to level in added time. Borough are now three points from safety.

Bottom side **Ipswich Wanderers** were thirteen points from safety at kick off with a maximum of eighteen available to them, so looked to be about to lose their hard earned Step Four status. Wanderers

hoped to keep their hopes alive for at least another week as they welcomed **Newmarket Town**, the travelling Jockeys also firmly resident in the relegation battle as they were only two points above the drop zone. Town were ahead after eighteen minutes, Oscar Dean with the opener, and they held on to their lead and the points, confirming relegation for Wanderers. The Jockeys have created a four point safety net.

Wroxham, one place and one point above the drop zone at kick off, hosted a side seven points behind them and in dire trouble. Basildon United had a winless run stretching back twenty five matches, a period which had delivered four points from seventy five available, and despite looking more solid of late needed to start winning again if they were to have any chance of staying up. The Yachtsmen were ahead on eighteen minutes, Ryan Hawkins keeping his cool from the spot, and it soon got worse for the Bees, Michael Toner dismissed eight minutes later. On sixty four minutes Rvan Miles made it two-nil, and within two minutes it was three, Craig Parker with that one. The scoring stopped there, Wroxham three points clear of the relegation places after Haringey Borough conceded a late equaliser. Basildon are ten points from safety with five matches left.

HORSES, DICTATORS AND SCANDALS: PERUGIA'S GOLDEN AGE

Italian football is certainly full of colourful characters. From the playing staff to the board, there has been a swirl of money, dodgy connections, and the allure of immortality in the peninsula. Despite the antics of those in Milan, Turin and Rome, Italian football's traditional powerhouses, it's possible that the man most associated with crazy calcio is in fact Luciano Gaucci, a former bus driver and racehorse owner who decided to spend his fortune not on the glamour of a European powerhouse, but the romantic appeal Perugia. He delivered a golden age, and not a small number of scandals.

Perugia before Gaucci had one very bright, heartbreaking season, finishing second in Serie A in 1979 despite delivering an unbeaten season. The following year, they were embroiled in one of Italian football's many scandals, and relegated after being hit with a points deduction for match fixing. Five years in the top flight, and one magical season, ended in disgrace. Six years later they were at it again, and once again relegated. In the span of little more than a decade, Perugia had gone from an unbeaten campaign in Serie A to a place in Serie C. This was where the bus driver found them.

Gaucci had found that driving buses didn't fulfil his ambition, so his fortune was made after starting a cleaning business. When he had made enough money there, he turned to horses, founding a breeding and racing stable. After selling one of his champions, he was able to buy into football, and made grand promises of returning Perugia

to the top flight. By 1993, he was beginning to see results, and scandal.

Perugia had a strong 1992-93 season, making the playoffs in Serie C. Gaucci, funding the promotion charge, sold a horse to Emanuel Senzacqua. Selling a horse wouldn't usually have been noteworthy, but Senzacqua was also a Serie C referee, and was scheduled to take charge of the game against Siracusa. When Perugia did enough to progress, complaints were lodged, and the connection too obvious to ignore. For that season, Perugia's promotion was suspended. It should have signalled the end to Gaucci's association with the game, but instead they were promoted the following season, and secured consecutive promotions.

The club bounced between Serie A and Serie B for a couple of seasons, before settling in the top flight after promotion in the 1997-98 season. Gaucci reportedly had a library of 1000 tapes of players across the world, and Perugia became a hotbed of talent. Fabio Grosso, Gennaro Gattuso and Marco Materazzi joined, as well as Hidetoshi Nakata for a brief period before his form earned him a move to Roma. But this group of players were treated to some... interesting methods by their new coach, Serse Cosmi, as well as coaching a team among the elite of Italian football, was a part-time DI. He used to take his players to the city's stripclubs and screen erotic movies the night before games. Whatever his unusual approach for team bonding, it seemed to work. Perugia sustained

their top flight status for five years, the longest period since the 1970s. They qualified for Europe, and in 2003 even won the Intertoto Cup.

Gaucci used the period to buy a second club, Viterbese, and appointed the first female manager in the men's game. He then tried to sign a female player for Perugia, insisting of Birgit Prinz that 'she's very good' but also that 'she is very beautiful and has a great figure'. His antics, in Serie A, were on show to a much wider audience.

Prinz, perhaps wisely, never signed for Gaucci's team, but he had other ways to court the media attention he craved. Encouraged by Italian Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi, he invited the son of Muammar Gaddafi to the club. The Libyan leader had a stake in Juventus, and Berlusconi thought it might help relations between the two countries for Perugia to court his son. Not for investment, but as a player. The forward tested positive for nandrolone before his debut and was banned for three months, and when he did finally set foot on the pitch, to nobody's surprise he wasn't up

to standard. Despite the hiring of Diego Maradona and Ben Johnson as consultants, 'even at twice his current speed he would still be twice as slow as slow itself', wrote La Repubblica.

Gaucci also signed South Korean forward Ahn Jung-hwan. The forward was significantly better than Gaddafi, and something of a fan favourite, but Gaucci sacked him after the 2002 World Cup, when he scored the goal that knocked Italy out. It was a pattern of increasingly erratic behaviour that would end in tears.

In 2005, Gaucci was arrested on fraud charges. The accusations, given his history, were believable, and his subsequent flight from the police all but confirmed them. His sons were arrested, while funding for the team dried up. Perugia went into administration, and were relegated all the way back down to the third tier. For II Grifoni, it was to be expected. Any time they brush with greatness, the football gods seek to punish them.
