When I signed for Felixstowe in 2021, Boards and Crumpy spoke at length about the project ahead and it certainly hasn't disappointed. I'm nearing the end of my fourth season in red and white and it feels like we have got stronger and stronger every year. In the last four seasons we have made the playoffs three times and the Suffolk Premier Cup Final twice. It was a proud moment lifting the trophy a couple of weeks ago after beating Leiston on penalties at Bloomfields and now it feels like there is just one big piece of the puzzle left... I feel like I don't want to say the word and jinx it, but you all know what I'm talking about...



Looking back on this season, it's been yet another one full of great memories. Some of our most impressive victories this season have come in the cup competitions. We beat Needham Market (Step 2) and Leiston (Step 3) on our way to lifting the Suffolk Premier Cup, memories that I'm sure you supporters who love non-league football in Suffolk will treasure for many years to come. And let's not forget that FA Trophy run, beating Bishops Stortford (Step 3) 6-1 away from home and then losing on penalties to Boreham Wood in the 2nd Round who eventually went on to make the National League South playoffs. To achieve all of that and still finish second in the league on 85 points is a credit to everybody involved.

Interestingly, 85 points would have won us the league last season, but we are where we are and we now need to give everything to try and achieve our goal via the playoff route. Finishing second means we have home advantage and we know you will be out in your numbers on Tuesday night to get behind the team. The support this season has been amazing. Our average home crowd was up on last season and is another stat that has grown season after season.

Not many people know this...

In last Saturday's programme I mentioned all time appearances record and how there would be a new name at the top of the list come the final reckoning at the end of this season, but before I get to that I have to make an extended mention of our goalkeeper Harry Wright.

Signed in the last closed season Harry made his debut on the opening day against newly promoted Newmarket Town and since then has been ever present.

55 games, 4,950 minutes that's 82hrs 30mins and during that time has kept 17 clean sheets and conceded just 63 goals. That seems a big number when you first see it but in 55 games works out on average at one goal every 78 minutes, one goal every one hour and 18 minutes of a game that lasts 1hr and 30 minutes, that's a decent record by anyone's standard. Perhaps the highlight of his performances came at Bloomfields against National League (North) side Needham Market in the Semi-Final of the Suffolk Premier Cup. With the score 2-2 after 90 minutes, it came down to a five goal penalty shoot-out, up stepped Jack Ainsley, Josh Hitter & Sam Ford who all did the biz, while Harry matched them by pulling off three saves to send us through to the final after just three penalties!

New leader in the appearance charts after Saturday's game is Jordy Matthews with 378 appearances and 63 goals having made his debut for the club in 2008, with Stuart Ainsley on his heels at 372 appearances & 21 goals having made his debut in 2009. The positions won't change after tonight's game no matter who plays but a big clap to both players who have reached their totals in largely 38 game league seasons.

HOW DID I GET HERE TODAY?

The short answer is that I walked the 7-minute journey.

The long answer, and one that perhaps needs some background, is via a near 50-year love affair with Southampton Football Club. An affair that has taken me the length and breadth of the country, watching a team mostly short on quality, but high on commitment, through some rather mediocre times, all the way up to the bearably half-decent times. A glory hunter I most certainly was not!!!

They say the average man will change his bank account twice, his wife once, but his football club never. And that's me and the Saints in a nutshell. (case, more like)

Sunday May 26th 2025. Adam Armstrong scored the only goal to beat Leeds United to the coveted prize of promotion to the Premier League. It was a truly memorable 3 days out (hic) an "I was there" memory to last a lifetime. Now branded as the EPL (English Premier League) because frankly, it is now a global brand, not a domestic league. It's hard to imagine some of my heroes growing up gracing the "EPL" today. David Armstrong, Steve Moran, Francis Benali, Iain Dowie, and of course, Matt Le Tissier. Yes, even Matt would probably struggle in today's league, and might only be able to contribute 20 goals and 15 assists. But he is 56, so we can make allowances, for that.

So fast forward from May to August. Renewed optimism. Season ticket purchased, a new "red wall" safe standing area at St Mary's, and I'm leaving the house to get the 07:28 train for the opening home fixture against last season's strugglers Nottingham Forest. 3 points to kick start our season after an opening day defeat to 10-man Newcastle. 3 games in. Defeats to Forest and Man Utd, and a 1-1 draw against Ipswich Town, where we led from the 5th minute to the 95th minute. Yeah, that felt like a defeat too. Were those games entertaining? Did I feel engaged with the club? Did I feel appreciated as a paying customer by the club and its staff? No, no and no.

The football was slow and predictable, the stewards (now called security for some reason) were heavy handed and clearly on power trips, the food was appalling, the beaten Saints were up the tunnel without as much as a thank you wave, and the journeys home were slow, slow, slow. Slower than VAR in fact.

Three and done. That's me. I'll not be going back to St Mary's Stadium again. Unless Dexys Midnight Runners do a stadium tour one year and include SO14.

And that's why I'm here today, cheering on The Seasiders in this massive Isthmian League North Play off Semi-Final.

Having lived in both Felixstowe and Walton since the family moved back in 1980 from Lowestoft, it's fair to say i've been to a criminally low number of football matches at Delwood Avenue up until Covid hit. The Saints, and then family life, meant my free Saturdays could be counted on one hand each season. But after the



pandemic arrived, and we were all placed under house-arrest, I started to venture down more often once Boris gave us the green light. Still only infrequent visits, I did however re-connect with some good old friends from yesteryear and always enjoyed the day.

But it was only after my "Three and done" St Mary's experiences from August and September that I made the conscious decision that enough was enough. The professional game is no longer for me, and that I would become one of the ever-growing numbers of disillusioned folk that would get their weekly fix of the beautiful game at non-League level.



And so my final love affair began in earnest. Wednesday 2nd October. Mildenhall Town in The Suffolk Premier Cup. It rained. I got wet. I did not care. I would be home 7 minutes after the final whistle. No mad rush for a cab from Waterloo to Liverpool Street tonight.

As it happens, I wasn't home 7 minutes after the final whistle, it was nearer midnight. The clubhouse called my name, and being polite, I had to answer that call. Lovely staff, lovely beer, lovely company. What's not to like? And seeing a win in any cup competition is nice, although it never leads to anything other than the heartache of an elimination some time later in the season, so I walked home rather than skipped!!!!

Since that cold, wet night I have been to 33 of the subsequent 42 matches but I promise to up my percentage next season.

Redbridge away.

Everyone loves a 97th minute winner. Got the 07:28 train for this one, just like the olden days!!! Met up with my soon-to-move-up-north Wealdstone fan buddy Paul Coombes for a day of cultural exchange. Gave the home 'keeper 45 minutes of sterling advice on how to perform to a higher standard, and I think he appreciated that a lot... and then Tom rattled in that special goal!!!



Bishop's Stortford and Boreham Wood. Bracketing these 2 games together as they epitomise the Seasiders totally. Fantastic performances. To win 1-6 and then be a harsh penalty decision away from beating a National League South side were outstanding achievements.

A truly outstanding afternoon and night out with Lorro. Get there early was the advice, so we got the 2:10 bus. We are not taking any chances. An interview with LEON OTTLEY-GOOCH

Since joining Felixstowe & Walton United in 2020, Leon Ottley-Gooch has been a rock of consistency and versatility on the pitch. After briefly stepping away from football, he made a surprise return this season bringing experience, leadership, and passion back into the fold. As the Seasiders chase playoff glory and reflect on a season filled with highs and challenges, we caught up with Leon to talk comebacks, career reflections, cup triumphs, and what the future may hold.

You came out of retirement at the start of this season. What made you decide to return?

Two things. The first was I was still going to Perform Sport gym and kept crossing over with the boys doing their fitness testing and conditioning and couldn't get my head around not being involved. The second was last year's sportsman's dinner and talking to some people about being "a long time retired" making me think I still had something to offer.

Has your perspective on the game changed since returning from that brief retirement?

Only that there are a lot more players who are young enough to be my sons!

This season hasn't been without its setbacks—you've had some injury troubles. Have they impacted what you hoped to contribute?

Definitely, I wanted to really use this season to help the team and show that I'm not done yet but that isn't the way it's turned out and that's been hard to swallow.

Looking at your entire footballing career, what moments stand out as personal highlights?

Scoring at Portman Road, back to back promotions, scoring a hattrick in the final game of the season to help win the Isthmian North. Signing for Felixstowe and winning the Premier Cup.

Since joining Felixstowe & Walton in 2020, what have been the highlights of your time with the Seasiders?

Playing along side a truly good group of lads, not just as players but as people. Past and present they have all made my time at Felixstowe better.

How did it feel to lift the Suffolk Premier Cup?

Weirdly it was a relief! It was my fourth or fifth attempt. So glad to do it with this group and it was such an achievement especially with the level of opposition.

You've played under Boards and Andy for five years now, what's it been like working with them and how have they influenced you as a player?

Confidence in my ability and to try and be an example and share my experience with the new generation.

You've filled a lot of roles on the pitch over the years. Do you have a favourite position, or do you just enjoy being adaptable?

In my head I'm still a dynamic central midfielder! Not sure my body would agree though...

With the playoffs looming, what would it mean to you to make the final—and



possibly face your old club, Bury Town? It would be an amazing occasion if the all Suffolk final came around. It would mean the world to finally win the playoffs not just for me but the club I'm sure.

The Felixstowe Ultras have built quite a reputation for their passionate support. How important is their presence to you and the squad on matchdays?

They've been brilliant, it's such a massive boost to have that vocal support. Some of the chants have been quality. My favourite was singing "champions of Suffolk, you'll never sing that" to an Essex side!

Over your time at the club, you've clearly built strong bonds with teammates, staff, and fans. Do you see those relationships continuing after retirement?

I hope so, everyone around the club has made it such a great experience. I'll definitely make my way up to a few games next season.

Are we likely to see you on the pitch again next season—or is this really the final chapter?

Yeah I think that's it for me, when I'm fit, I think I can still do a job but I can't stay fit! Really gutted to have to admit it but 20+ years isn't too bad of a run.



And once you do hang up the boots—what's next? How will you fill your weekends?

My wife Lizzie has really got into fitness and is doing a lot of different events which I'm going to start joining her in. Other than that more time with the kids and the odd trip to the Martello Ground.

Which team do you support, and do you think you'll finally get the chance to watch them more when you retire?

I'm a United fan so no I won't be watching them more!

With Boards and Andy set to step away at the end of the season, how important would it be to secure Step 3 football as a fitting send-off for them?

Boards and Crumpy do so much for the club besides the first team. I think to achieve Step 3 would be the perfect way to sign off as they've worked so hard and along with everyone behind the scenes to get the club ready for the step up.

STOCK the fridges with bubbly, cue up the Queen CD and get ready to chomp through those fingernails.

The final day for clubs at Step 2-4 is suddenly here. Those dropped points back on August may seem a long time ago, but will they make all the difference this weekend?

While there are plenty of clubs throughout the National League System already in party mode and, in the National League, Barnet are just one point away from a return to the EFL, things aren't quite so clear cut everywhere.

Especially at Step 2. In the National League North, Kidderminster Harriers, Brackley Town and Scunthorpe United will all wake up in the morning hoping they are crowned champions come 5pm.

Kiddy, who beat Hereford 5-1 on Easter Monday, will start the day in top spot on goal difference. They travel to Southport knowing a win will seal their place back in Non-League's top flight – barring a 22-goal swing from Brackley! The Saints host already relegated Farsley Celtic so will be hoping to bank the three points and that Harriers slip.

Scunthorpe United are two points back. Their goal difference is vastly superior to Brackley's but five behind Kiddy. Ideally they need Kiddy to lose at Southport or, should Phil Brown's side draw, and they need to smash Hereford, who are trying to secure their own play-off place too. That, along with Brackley making an unlikely mess of things at Farsley with a draw or defeat, will put Scunny on top.

That's all relatively straightforward compared to the National League South where SIX teams are in with a shout!

Truro City begin the day top on goal difference, narrowly ahead of Torquay United.

Eastbourne Borough and Worthing sit a point back from those two, with Boreham Wood and

Dorking another two points behind and only able to finish first on goal difference. Crucially, however, both have a better goal difference than both Truro and Torquay. Talk about exciting.

You'd argue all six have games they would be expected to win. Football tends to show us it's unlikely they all will.

Truro host a St Albans City side who are in the final relegation spot and need to better Salisbury's result. Torquay are at Hemel, Eastbourne host Weston-super-Mare – who are now out of the play-off running – while Worthing travel to Enfield Town, who can almost taste survival but still aren't quite there and could end up dropping if both Salisbury and St Albans pick up victories.

Dorking host Chesham and Boreham Wood are at Tonbridge Angels. The play-offs will be quite something regardless who is in them.

The drama continues further down too with a three-way fight between Billericay Town, Horsham and Dartford in the Isthmian Premier.

The trio are split by goal difference – it's just one between Billericay and Horsham – and all are at home to teams with nothing to play for.

Bedford Town are a point away from glory in the Southern Premier Central as they sit three points ahead of Kettering Town. However, the Poppies' goal difference means things would change if they lose at home to Stourbridge and Kettering beat Banbury at home.

It's a similar story in NPL Division One West where Widnes start the day three points ahead of Hednesford Town but if they lose and the Pitmen win, they could be pipped on goal difference.

And Yate Town are three points in front of Evesham United in Southern League Division One Central with a plus two goal difference as it stands.

Where the bubbly will be sprayed at full-time remains to be seen. For those who miss out it will have to go back in the fridge. There's always the play-offs...





THE OTHER SIDE BRIGHTLINGSEA REGENT

A BRIEF HISTORY

Brightlingsea Regent, previously Brightlingsea United, have completed around 100 years of competitive football. Firstly, in the Border league, between **1908**/ **1909** to **1970** when they joined The Essex Senior league for 20 years having much success, before going on to join the then Jewson League in **1990** and then back to the Border league in **2001/2002**. Brightlingsea United FC and Regent Park Rangers FC amalgamated at the start of **2005/2006** season to become Brightlingsea Regent Football Club. During this time, the squad and club have continued to grow and develop, having success in the Border league Division 1 and cup.

In **2009/2010** new Management team James Webster and Mark Gridley guided Regent to a 4th place finish and followed up the following season in **2010/2011** by winning the Kent Blaxill Premier border league in a superb season by playing 34, winning 31, drawing 2 and losing just 1 game.

In season **2011/2012**, James Webster added Tom Rothery to the Management team in September and they finished their first season back at step 6 with a creditable 5th place finish. They also reached the quarter-final of the Essex Senior Cup before losing to League 2 side Dagenham & Redbridge. The **2012/ 2013** season was successful for many reasons. Firstly, an FA Vase cup run, which was the longest in the clubs history before bowing out in round 3 (last 64). The club gained promotion back to step 5 and the Premier Division with a third-place finish which included a 22-game unbeaten run during the season. In the final game of the season the team won the First Division KO Cup final with a 1-0 victory over Gt Yarmouth.

The 2013/2014 season in the Eastern Counties Premier Division again proved to be successful for Brightlingsea, gaining promotion after finishing Runners-up to Hadleigh Utd, losing out on the final day by goal difference. The club also reached the last 16 of the FA Vase and in doing so again created history.

The **2016/2017** season saw Brightlingsea Regent crowned as champions of the Isthmian North Division,



notching up an impressive 103 points and finishing 12 points ahead of their closest rivals, ensuring an historic promotion to the Isthmian Premier League.

In October 2017 long-standing manager James Webster left the club to be replaced by former assistant manager and coach Tom Rothery, assisted by Pip Boyland, who maintained the R's Isthmian Premier league standing and won the Essex FA's Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup.

2018/2019 saw the Regent achieve their highest ever finish in the non-league pyramid, along with their best ever FA Cup and FA Trophy runs. They also retained the Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup with a 1-0 victory at Maldon & Tiptree.

After Tom Rothery stepped down from the manager's position in September 2019, Colchester United legend Kem Izzet took the hot seat and avoided relegation in his first season in charge, In a season that was cut short in February due to Covid-19.

2020/2021 A later than usual start to the season saw Regent make an early management change as Kem Izzet departed the club in October, replaced with the management duo of Tom Austin and Ryan Salter, arriving from FC Clacton. The season was then curtailed in December and no more football was played.

2021/2022 Tom Austin and Ryan Salter resigned from their positions at the beginning of November with the club positioned within the relegation places. The R's appointed Brett Munyard and his team of Mark Healy, Ricky Stubbs and Dave Limber who dramatically saved the club from relegation on the penultimate game of the season with a 3-0 victory over Haringey Borough to secure Step 3 football for the 6th season.

2022/2023 Brightlingsea Regent suffered their first relegation under the Regent name, finishing bottom of the Isthmian Premier Division following a 6-year spell and returned to the Isthmian North Division for the 2023/2024 season.

2023/2024 saw the Regent have a good start back in the Isthmian North Division, Iosing just one of their first ten games, a defeat in the 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup to Billericay Town. Mid-season, Ryan Salter returned as Assistant Manager and the R's finished the season strong with a final position of 8th in the league.

2024/2025 Brett Munyard left the club in November 2024 and Ryan Salter became the First Team Manager, with Pip Boyland taking over the



Assistant Manager position.Pip Boyland departed the club in February 2025 and George Christou and Jack Toghli joined as Assistant Manager and Head Coach respectively.

PEN PICS

RYAN SALTER – MANAGER; Ryan steps up to the manager's role after Brett Munyard's depature in November 2024. Ryan returned to the Regent last season after managing FC Clacton. He needs no introduction to the Regent having played 106 times and later became Head Coach under then manager James Webster. Salts was an integral asset to the club when it was promoted to the Isthmian Premier League in 2017. He later left the club to link back up with Webster at Aveley before taking the role as assistant to Tom Austin at FC Clacton. Ryan is a dedicated hard-working manager who knows how to get the best out of his players.

GEORGE CHRISTOU – ASSISTANT MANAGER

George joined Aveley in 2017 and helped build a really successful academy programme, winning the Essex Senior Reserve League title and a cup double before stepping up to coaching the first team. In 2020, George and Jack took the reins at Redbridge, guiding the club back to Step 4 with promotion from the Essex Senior League, and last season winning the Essex Senior Cup.

JACK TOGHLI - HEAD COACH; Jack, along with George, joined Aveley in 2017 and helped build a really successful academy programme, winning the Essex Senior Reserve League title and a cup double before stepping up to coaching the first team. In 2020, they took the reins at Redbridge, guiding the club back to Step 4 with promotion from the Essex Senior League, and last season winning the Essex Senior Cup.

MARK EDWARDS – GOALKEEPER COACH; Mark

joined the Regent in the 23/24 season as goalkeeping coach having previously been at East Thurrock United, Brentwood Town, Basildon United, Tilbury and Aveley. He looks to have been a solid addition to Brett Munyard's team with his excellent work with Lewis Greene.

BRIAN SWIFT – PHYSIO; Brian is one of the most experienced physio therapists in the area. He has been involved in professional setups and within non-league football. Brian is a huge asset to the dressing room and management team and we are very lucky to have him at the club.



ALAN WRIGHT - KITMAN; Alan has been with the club for several years in different positions, he has managed and led a team through from Youth to Senior on two occasions at the club. Also, the Vice-Chair, Alan is always keen to help and get stuck in on and off the field, he is a fantastic club man who bleeds Brightlingsea Regent. He will be a massive help to all the squad over the next 10 months.

CHRISTIAN NORTH – GOALKEEPER; Christian joins the R's from Tilbury having impressed during a loan spell earlier in the season. A solid shot-stopper, Christian won promotion from the Essex Senior League last season with Tilbury.

PITCHING

The primary focus of our Pitching In Isthmian North afternoon was directed at nineteenth place, which was the place that Wroxham, Newmarket Town and Haringey Borough wanted to avoid!

Haringey Borough occupied that final relegation spot at kick off despite being eight matches unbeaten, their longest unbeaten run of the campaign. They had a difficult match in prospect as they travelled to take on fifth place Brightlingsea Regent, and news of Wroxham's lead against Borough can't have been nice for the travelling faithful to hear, but it would have been nicer than what they were soon to witness as lake Clowsley put Regent ahead on eleven minutes. The equaliser arrived five minutes into added time, Zayshaun Asamoah with it, but there wasn't enough time left to find a winner and Borough are relegated. We'll miss them, particularly their noisy fans, who have remained noisy all season despite not being given too much to shout about. Regent will travel to Felixstowe and Walton United in Tuesday's Play Off Semi-Final.

Newmarket Town took a one point advantage to the seaside to face **Concord Rangers**, and had lost only one of six, whilst Rangers had seen their season crash to an end. The Beachboys had lost their previous five, and indeed seven of their last eight, and they lost a player on the half hour, Evernage Nyahunda dismissed. The ten men held out until seventeen minutes from time when Stan Leech scored for the Jockeys, but the hosts were quickly level, Steve Cawley with the equaliser. As it turned out, that was good enough for the Jockeys to stay up.

Wroxham started the day two points clear of Haringey Borough and one ahead of Newmarket Town in the fight to avoid the drop. The Yachtsmen had a difficult task, second place **Bury Town** making the trip and hoping to seal that second spot and the home play off advantage that came with it, but it was the hosts who made an early breakthrough, Shaun Taylor scoring on seven minutes. Joe White levelled for the visitors with twenty one minutes remaining, but that was how it ended- confirming survival for the Yachtsmen whilst seeing Bury drop to third. Bury welcome Waltham Abbey in Tuesday evening's Play Off Semi-Final.

Victory for **Felixstowe and Walton United** and anything other than a win for Bury at Wroxham would see them take second spot as they had a far better goal difference, and they went ahead against visitors **Witham Town** on twenty minutes, Sam Ford making the breakthrough. The Seasiders quickly added a second, Rob Harvey with it, but Town got a goal back in added time at the end of the first half when Kamani Mcfarlane scored from the spot. In added time at the end of the second half Charlie Warren made it three-one to the



hosts, but somehow there was still time for more, Sonny Dutton bringing it back to three-two. Finally, that was that- and it took the Seasiders up to second and confirmed a Tuesday Play Off Semi-Final with Brightlingsea Regent the visitors.

The Abbotts travel to Bury Town on Tuesday, Hall end the season in fifteenth.

Sixth place **Tilbury** hosted up and coming **Maldon & Tiptree** - perhaps a precursor for a promotion battle next season? The Jammers went ahead on sixteen minutes, Kai Brown the scorer, but the Dockers were soon level, Jordan Clark with the equaliser. That turned out to be that, Tilbury ending the campaign in sixth, Maldon in thirteenth. **Gorleston** took an incredible twenty match unbeaten run on the road to **Redbridge**. The Greens, who started the day in eighth, fell behind on twenty four minutes, Fotsing Pitoula Wabo with the opener for the Motormen, but levelled just before the hour, Cameron Beazer the scorer. The Motormen were ahead once more on sixty seven minutes, Doriano Tanzillo with that one, but again the Greens levelled, Joseph Marsden making it two-two. The goals stopped there, and Gorleston's unbeaten run will move into next season!

Grays Athletic took an eleven match unbeaten run which included nine wins on the road to East London, where they took on relegated **Sporting Bengal United**. Athletic went ahead eleven minutes into the second half, Alejandro Piedrahita Machado the scorer, and Harry Hope took only six more minutes to make it two-nil. Danny Sambridge, soon to leave Athletic after many years service, came out of his goal to take a penalty on sixty nine minutes and made it three-nil for a fairytale ending, and the hosts went down to ten men fifteen minutes from time, Myles Dominique sent off. There were no more goals, but Athletic won't mind, as they end the season in ninth place.

Walthamstow hosted our champions, Brentwood Town - and went ahead midway through the first half, Jordan Peart putting away a spot kick. Bilal Sayoud made it two-nil with eleven minutes to go, and that was that, Stow ending the campaign in tenth and five unbeaten.

Relegated **Basildon United**, without a win since October, hoped to end the campaign - and their Isthmian stay - on a high as they hosted **Cambridge City**. City went ahead just after the hour, Junior Mubiayi the scorer, and they held on to take the points.

Finally, **Heybridge Swifts** hosted **Ipswich Wanderers**. The visitors, relegation confirmed, went ahead in first half added time through Ashton Bullard, and it was a lead they held, to end the campaign in twentieth. Swifts are fourteenth, losing nine of their last eleven.
