


Enjoy the game and let's cheer the boys on to another valuable three points.

Not many people know this...

I remember the day that now seems an age ago, when we as a club said "we've done it" as we confirmed our promotion to Step 4 for the first time in the club's history, and it was with both trepidation and excitement we looked forward to a whole new football landscape for the club.

Sitting here now (you're reading this a few days later), looking out of my window, 13 games into our 8th season at Step 4 I feel we have made our mark and that the Seasiders are an established Step 4 club who perhaps should be playing Step 3 football this season, but that's for another day, this week I thought I would check up on how many players we had used on our journey to get this far.

Our first season 2018/19 we finished a very

respectable 11 th and used just 17 players. We then had two interrupted seasons thanks to Covid and three seasons where we have finished in the top six, two of which were in the play-off spots and one (last season) we finished runners-up.

Some may think it's a lot, personally I was surprised at how few players we have used over the past 8 years.

The first season was tough as we learnt how to deal with the extra travelling and for various reasons we lost several players at the end of that season, but over 8 seasons all the managers, in my opinion, have recruited well and strengthened the side season on season.

Oh yes a total of 87 players have been used spread over those 8 years.



Hi everyone, and welcome to the latest instalment of our away day reviews, bringing you the highs and lows of the "Away Day" experience following our club Felixstowe & Walton Utd around the country.

Our shortest journey of the season was, perhaps surprisingly, on a Tuesday night in September, as the Seasiders faithful descended en masse to The Brantham Leisure Centre, home of The Blue Imps. Our hosts were promoted from The Thurlow Nunn Eastern Counties League last season, and are finding it tough at Step 4, with only a single point from an opening day draw gained at fellow newcomers Stanway Rovers collected so far.

Lorro was on driving duties for this one and he duly picked Isaac up before getting me and heading out in the rush hour traffic. We detoured through Brantham to pick up Mistley John and parked up on Factory Lane, as Stuart had circulated the news that there was no public car park available.

Our first point of contact with Brantham Athletic was the turnstile operator, and due to the loudness of his tutting when the answer to cash or card was card by those ahead of me in the queue, I rummaged in my wallet and pockets in an urgent need to find £10 of printed and minted money to hand over!!!





The clubhouse at Brantham is well appointed, and most of the pitch can be seen from the doors and windows. As we headed to the bar for urgent refreshments we were greeted by regular away-dayers Shaun, Big Neil, Big Pete and Little Pete. It's a bit confusing at times as Big Pete is about a foot shorter than Little Pete, but as they are Father and Son, it seems the best way to describe them. Old Pete and Young Pete does not sit right, although factually correct.

A couple of pints of Poretti later (Peroni meets Moretti?) and it was time to enter the white hot cauldron of the Brantham arena, although the march to our vantage point was delayed somewhat waiting for the arrival of the 2 teams and the officials as the gate was closed and, somewhat annoyingly, the ground is only open on 3 sides.

After a brief delay, the boys entered the playing surface and the gate opened, so we found ourselves happily taking up first half residence behind the goal at the clubhouse end, next to the quirky grandstand that is situated in that corner of the ground. This stand is home to the Brantham Ultras, a highly organised and military-styletrained gang of 30 or more of the craziest dudes

you'll find in this league, and we loved every minute of it. I was pleased they had made it, as it was a school night......

The lads did not stop singing for the entire first 45 minutes, despite being a clear second best and with the result never in doubt from the moment Josh Hitter opened the scoring just before the half hour mark. Big Neil appeared at this point and was most surprised to learn it was 0-1 as he and (so he says) several other fans on the far touchline thought it was now 0-2. I am not sure what game they were watching or if the Poretti was stronger than it's near-namesakes, but he genuinely looked befuddled when told it was very much only 0-1. There had been an early disallowed effort, but the referees whistle had sounded before the ball nestled in the net and the free kick was taken from the 6 vard line..... surely that wasn't the cause for the confusion?



The second half was spent in the company of the lovely Cheryl (minus her clipboard) and several other regular travellers at the far end. Before an hour had been played it was 0-3 and we were forced to make our own entertainment for large swathes of the final third of the game as Brantham tried in vain to knock on Harry Wrights door, but in truth they never really got past the garden gate, let alone up the path towards the door.

Thankfully for us, the loanee Brantham keeper was providing us with plenty of entertainment,

as we had discovered earlier that his nickname was Poppadom Hands, because the ball went through his hands far too easily.

"Don't worry keeper, your Naan is proud of you" was amongst a long list of curry-inspired shout-outs to the young man, and he did take it all in his stride, although you could see his confidence start to saag towards the end.



Dan Gilchrist added a fourth near the end, and the faithful returned to the clubhouse for a nightcap whilst I hung back to take a couple of photographs of the ground from areas I had not frequented during the evening. At least, that was the plan. Within 4-5 minutes of the final whistle sounding, whilst some players were on

the pitch warming down and spectators slowly dispersing, and with media reports being penned, for some inexplicable reason the floodlights were switched off, bringing the entire venue into near total darkness. This was particularly frustrating for club photographer Stefan Peck OBE(*) Stef had not even begun to put away his many and varied array of equipment. Cameras, gimbals, tripods, go-pros, lens, totem poles. You name it, it was still dotted around various parts of the pitch and perimeters.

Thankfully we live in an age where everyone carries a phone, and phones have torches, so Mrs Peck joined me in shining some light for Stef to pack away a lot of equipment. I would like to know if BAFC always switch their lights off so early (every penny counts, I get that) or was there a deeper issue here?

I re-joined the boys back in the bar for a drink before we headed home and upon checking other results and fixtures, we noticed that Brantham host Tilbury in 7 days time, this being 4 days before we head to Tilbury ourselves. We agreed on a scouting mission, some more Poretti, a sing-song with the Brantham Ultras, and to ask about the floodlights going off so early.

Before that, FA Trophy action at Chadfields. Bring it on.....

STEP 3 clubs enter the Isuzu FA Trophy at this third qualifying round stage this weekend – and already the Road to Wembley is shaping up into another thrilling adventure.

They join the 40 clubs from Step 4 to progress from the previous round to make up 64 intriguing ties, starting with Bradford Park Avenue versus Heaton Stannington and Worcester City against Rugby Town on Friday night.

As compiled by our friends at Non-League Factfile, two-time winners Grays Athletic are the last ones standing of the 32 clubs that started this season's campaign in the preliminary round.

The 2004-05 and 2005-06 winners visit Hanwell Town and are one of four former winners competing in this round alongside Canvey Island (2000-01), Bishop's Stortford (1980-81) and Hednesford Town (2003-04).

Indeed, Hednesford, flying high in Northern Premier League Premier division under manager Gavin Hurren, are involved in one of the ties of the round when they go to Southern League Premier Central leaders Harborough Town.

At the other end of the FA Trophy experience spectrum are seven debut clubs still involved, namely Lower Breck, Silsden, Shifnal Town, Sporting Club Inkberrow, Stanway Rovers, Hartpury and AFC Portchester – all bar one of which take on Step 3 opposition.

Hartpury have been handed a dream tie against high-flying Southern Premier South neighbours Gloucester City, similarly AFC Portchester, who can expect a big crowd at the Wicor Recreation Ground when Taunton Town visit.

Silsden and Sporting Club Inkberrow are at home, to Stocksbridge Park Steels and Stratford Town respectively, while Lower Breck and Shifnal Town face tough trips to Stockton Town and Gainsborough Trinity.

Stanway Rovers are the only debut club to face Step 4 opposition when Uxbridge make the trip to Hawthorns.

Derby days are also aplenty this weekend with Suffolk pair AFC Sudbury and Bury Town locking horns, while Bracknell Town and Hungerford Town will be vying for Berkshire honours. Local bragging rights are at stake also for Waltham Abbey v Walthamstow.

Elsewhere, there are 25 other clubs for whom victory would either equal or set a best FA Trophy run. However, only AFC Rushden and Diamonds versus Malvern Town and Ashford United v Biggleswade FC will guarantee that outcome. Those two ties are two of five that guarantee a Step 4 club will be in the first round.

St Ives Town versus Kettering Town is the most common tie of the round with St Ives ahead by two wins to one in past Trophy games. Meanwhile, Ashton United knocked out

Clitheroe in both their previous Trophy matches separated by exactly 50 years in 1970 and 2020.

St Albans City and Bideford FC have had to wait 43 and 47 years respectively for the chance to avenge past Trophy defeats by Aveley and Dorchester Town, whilst the 7-2 win for Barwell over Bromsgrove Sporting the last time they met in the Trophy is the two clubs' respective biggest win and heaviest defeat in the competition.

A Step 3 side has won the FA Trophy as recently as Hornchurch in the Covid year of 2020-21 – and that will give lower league clubs hope that the Road to Wembley is very much open to all.

Step 2 Spennymoor Town made it all the way to Non-League Finals Day just five months ago, giving their fans a day out they will never forget. Dreams do come true.

Tribute to three stalwarts of Felixstowe & Walton United FC

Last Saturday, prior to Felixstowe & Walton United's home league game against Newmarket Town, a Memorial Bench was unveiled, honouring the dedication of three men who each gave over 50 years' service to the Felixstowe Club.

Ray Stanbridge, Ron Churchyard and Graham Smart were respectively remembered in a short ceremony, attended by their families and close friends.

After a warm welcome to those present, from Chairman Tony Barnes, it was President Dave Ashford, who served alongside these three legends, who was invited to say a few words about their contribution to the Club's progress over the years.

They passed away within 10 months of each other, between November 2022 and October

2023, all attending home games until their passing. All were in their late 70's.

Ashford explained that Ray Stanbridge, a Felixstowe man, had first played for Felixstowe Town first XI in the Ipswich & District League when he was just 14 years old. He also played for ITFC Youths in the Mercia League.

He represented Suffolk on many occasions and assisted the Felixstowe Club during their progress through the ESBL and to their current level, at Step 4 in the Isthmian League North.

He also managed Walton United for a few seasons, and served on the Committee on occasions for FTFC.

Ron Churchyard, meanwhile, was a Stowmarket man who moved to Felixstowe due to the expansion of Felixstowe Port. Ron was a self-employed haulier, but preferred to be known as a Lorry Driver.

Ron was "The Quiet Man", in Ashford's opinion, and assisted FTFC in numerous ways.

He helped in repairs required in the Old Pavilion and around the ground. He also put in his own cash into the Club from time to time, to keep the Club afloat.

Ron also took on the job as Manager of FTFC's 3rd team, who played on Sundays on the current first team pitch. He also played a few games for Felixstowe Town Reserves.

Ron was a loyal and honest, trustworthy Club Member.

Graham Smart was a Trimley man through-and-through. 'Smarty' – as he was known everywhere locally – played for both FTFC and Walton United.

His family's links with Walton United go back to the 1930's, when his father, Jimmy Smart, played for them.

Graham eventually became manager of FTFC under-16 team when the Club joined The lpswich & District Youth League in July 1986.

He obtained sponsorship, drove the bus to away games, and used his own money to support the lads. Furthermore, in February 1988, Smarty agreed to co-manage The League's Select XI. This affable, warmly polite man was also involved in local "shoots" and enjoyed fishing trips.

The wording on the Memorial Bench was compiled by Ron's daughter, Kate, and reads:

"Please be seated, you are in the Company of Legends."

The children of the three families all grew up in and around the Club and all helped at some stage in keeping the Club going through various difficult times.

Ray, Ron and Graham assisted in the rise of the Club from the local Ipswich league to the level enjoyed today.

They should never be forgotten for their contribution to the Club's progress, and it is fitting that they have been suitably honoured.



MANAGEMENT

Jack Ainsley - Manager

Rejoined for a second spell at the club from Stowmarket in 2023. Jack played professionally for ITFC after coming through their academy and went on to make four appearances playing under Roy Keane. Jack went on to have spells at Step 2 with Lowestoft and Step 3 with Leiston but is back at the Seaside as player/joint manager with brother Stuart.

Stuart Ainsley - Manager

Stuart joined the club for his second spell in 2014 from Lowestoft Town. Previous clubs include Chelmsford City, Canvey Island and AFC Sudbury. Stuart spent ten years at Ipswich Town, winning the FA Youth Cup in 2005. Having spent the last 11 years playing for Felixstowe, began his management career alongside brother Jack in May 2025.

Stuart Stevensen - Fitness Coach

After hanging up his boots Stuart joined Felixstowe Utd as a fitness coach/physio, then on to Trimley to help coach his son's team from the U8s-U16s. Stuart rejoined the Seasiders to coach the U18s which lead him on to being part of the first team staff. Stuart is an FA level 2 coach and an FA level 1 mentor.



Leon Ottley-Gooch - First Team Coach

Leon signed for the club in 2020 and is another vastly experienced player at step 3 and 4 level. Previous clubs include Leiston, Bury Town, Hadleigh Utd and Stowmarket Town. Leon is very versatile but is predominantly a dynamic midfield player. Was appointed first team coach in May 2025.

John Abbott - Physio

John is a vastly experienced physio, qualifying in 1992 and dedicating 37 years to the NHS. Previous football clubs include Enfield Town, Tottenham and Stevenage before taking early retirement to move to Felixstowe, where he joined the seasiders in October 2024.

Alex Egelton - Goalkeeper Coach/Coach

Alex returned to Felixstowe last season having spent many years coaching within the youth and reserve setups at the club. Alex heads up the Goalkeeping section of the club and works with







the Youth section right through to the Seniors and is an important member of the First Team Management structure.

Joe came through the ITFC Youth system before playing for the likes of Needham, Bury and most recently AFC Sudbury where he captained their side. A left sided defender, Joe offers composure, a wonderful left foot and a toughness and desire to defend to the back line.

Ollie was signed in the summer of 2024 from neighbours AFC Sudbury and has played in recent years for Stowmarket and Leiston. An energetic and attacking full back who loves to get forward and create chances and with a wealth of higher level experience to boot.

Hugh is a local lad who left Felixstowe's youth system and progressed through the Needham Market Academy. Hugh signed back with his local club in the summer of 2024 and has

Hugo is an academy graduate that is now starting to flourish with his progression into the first team squad. A tough tackling and tenacious defender who likes to get forward.

A RIGHT WING RADICAL

Football has been a reflection of the various prejudices in the country almost since its inception. Black footballers still frequently face racism from the stands, and for many decades faced it in the institutions of the game too. And women's football, similarly, has faced the institutional discrimination of the FA, being banned for half a century just as it started to compete in popularity with the men's game. It shouldn't be surprising, therefore, that the story of the first black woman to play the game has gone largely untold. But even before the death of Queen Victoria, there she was, pioneering a path in a world that, in many ways, simply didn't want her. Her name was Emma Clarke.

Clarke was born in 1876 on Merseyside, just a few streets from the suffragist Helen Graham Matthews, who would become a significant figure in her footballing career. She worked at a nearby sweetshop, and played football on the streets with her sister, developing quite an unladylike interest in the game. But with Matthews living nearby, there was no such thing as 'unladylike'. When the writer and feminist Lady Florence Dixie set up a football team, the British Ladies Football Club, Clarke was a prime candidate and signed up. There is a photograph of her lining up for their first ever exhibition match, playing for the 'South' team.

The 'fleet footed dark girl on the right wing', as the South Wales Daily News described her, was certainly noteworthy. Women's football was ridiculed at this time, a curiosity rather than a serious pursuit, but Clarke stood out for more than her skin colour. When she wasn't terrorising full backs, she occasionally played in goal as well. The British Ladies drew crowds of over 10,000, and Clarke would have been paid a shilling a week for turning out for them. Derided curiosity or not, women's football was already big business.

In 1896, Clarke joined the team named for her childhood neighbour, Mrs Graham's XI. She was selected as part of the team that went on a tour to Scotland, playing in matches that once again drew thousands of curious onlookers. The first international between England and Scotland's women had taken place in 1881, and any opportunity to watch the two go head to head was attractive. Players received expenses for their trip, while once again big money was made.

The unorganised nature of women's football at the turn of the century meant that, in 1897, Clarke was on the move once again, this time to a team described as 'The New Woman and Ten of her Lady Friends'. The 'new woman' was a reference to the feminist ideal of a radical, political woman, fighting for suffrage. Right from the start, women's

football was a political endeavour, because of those who backed it and because of those who opposed it. In many ways, simply by playing the men's game, Clarke was one of a progressive few pushing for the kind of change in society that would take decades to achieve.

While with The New Lady, she took part in a game against a men's team, with her sister. The game was described as grotesque, although the women were reported to have distinguished themselves in the second half. Despite the hostility to women playing the game, The New Lady won 3-1, proving that they could compete with men and striking another blow for their cause.

Clarke played for various teams in exhibitions until 1903, when record of her as a footballer seems to disappear. Her entire story was nearly washed from history, wrongly attributed to Carrie Bousted who was believed to be a non-white goalkeeper from the Netherlands, until investigations into the Mrs. Graham tour of Scotland dug up a photograph

that showed Bousted to be white, and also featured Clarke. Fortunately, that led to an investigation that uncovered her story.

Britain's first black female footballer now has a blue plaque commemorating her life, in Crouch End where she spent much of her playing career (if one would call it a career). It's rare for one life to advance so many causes, without seeming to have actively addressed any of them, but it's fair to say that Emma Clarke was involved in the struggle for women's representation in football, for non-white representation in football, and ultimately for the drive by suffragists and suffragettes for women to get the vote in this country. It is ironic, therefore, that the achievement of the last of those goals came hand-in-hand with the devastation of the first, as the FA banned the women's game a year after the vote was achieved.

But for Clarke, she just played football.


